Long Term Council Community Plan 2009-2019

- Waylon explained that outlining the LTCCP was one of the key purposes of the Youth Forum
- Jaime explained how the LTCCP was a 10 year plan as to what was happening and who was paying for it
- He outlined the challenges to the LTCCP in regards to the environmental, social and economic climates
- Explained the purposes of rates, essentially a land/property tax

Environment	Recycling and rubbish collection and looking after open spaces. Proposed to defer developing new tracks, maintain public areas less, and to review recycling
Social, Recreational and Wellbeing	Swimming pools, housing units, libraries and recreation areas. Pools will be prioritised for learning to manage demand. Also some increase in user charges. Also looks at the indoor sports centre and artificial sports fields
Cultural Wellbeing	Support of art galleries, museums and public art. Planning to reduce spending on public art, build an 'Arts Hub'
Economic Development	Spending money on events for tourism benefits. Will be spending more for the Rugby World Cup and also Te Papa
Transport	Streets, traffic lights etc. Proposal to work on public transport generally
Urban Development	Looking after heritage sights and looking at building consent. Still investigating the Golden Mile issue
Governance	Consultation and elections. Trying to make it easier for people to be

- o Oral submissions are from the 25th 29th May and can be very effective
- o Ben expresses concern that the video might not maintain the interest of the students
