1. Opening

Outcome of the MYD grant application

The YC's grant application to the Ministry of Youth Development for its earthquake preparedness crowdsourcing project was declined. An application will now be made to the UNESCO Youth Forum initiative.

Local Body Elections project update

Rawinia spoke to the tabled project update. The project is on track.

Position on the Evolve Board

YC Performance Expectations

This item was deferred.

Living Wage

Elise Webster gave a brief presentation about the in-principle decision for WCC to become a Living Wage Council and about the possibility of Wellington becoming a Living Wage City. A living wage is the pay rate required to support 2 adults and 2 children have a modest lifestyle on one full time and one part time wage. In Wellington the rate has been calculated at \$18.40 per hour, which is significantly higher than the minimum wage, which is currently \$13.75. Officers will be reporting back to City Councillors in November with options for implementing the Living Wage at WCC.

YC members then debated the pros and cons of Living Wage and agreed to discuss this further at a later date.

Farewell Stevenson

Stevenson informed everyone that this was his last meeting, having served on the YC for 6 years. Stevenson will leave in 2 weeks time for an exchange in the United States of America.
