2.1. Greg O'Connor - MP for Ōhāriu

Greg talked about a range of topics including his journey in to politics, the upcoming local body elections, and housing.

2.2. Students Strike for Climate – Molly Doyle, Elliot Blyth

Molly and Elliot talked about the upcoming School Strike for Climate on the 27th September 2019 and the associated 'week of action' leading up to it.

Molly and Elliot suggested that Youth Council:

- Run a workshop during the 'week of action'.
- Sign up to their partner program when it is live.
- Reach out to their networks to share information about the strike.

Youth Council suggested that:

- WCC facilitate meetings between young people and WCC environmental officers. (Jackson)
- WCC may be able to help provide venues for workshops and other activities associated with the strike. (Brad)
- WCC share information on the special voting process with SS4C. (Jackson)
- Youth Council send people along to the strike with information about voting in the local body elections. (Brad)

Action points

- Sean will investigate whether WCC environmental officers would be willing to consider meeting with young people.
