
Quarterly Review - Wellington Museums Trust

Wellington Museums Trust has presented its report for the quarter ended 31 December 2011 for review. A summary of key findings is presented below and the report is attached.

Highlights / Summary

- Overall, visitor numbers for the Trust in Q2 (including Carter) were 169,163, 9.6% below budget of 175,760. Oceania at City Gallery did not achieve projected audience numbers and Capital E's Give it a Try achieved visits of 1,354 and revenue of \$12,248 compared to targets of 2,000 and \$17,391.
- The Capital E National Theatre for Children's production of Hear to See won three awards in the 2011 Chapman Tripp Theatre Awards including the Absolutely Positively Wellington Award for most original production in 2011 and awards to composer Richard Nunns and audiovisual designer Johann Notie.
- Trust institutions concluded 2011 RWC programming with Hard on the Heels at the Museum of Wellington City & Sea. This was the most successful exhibition, attracting 18,305 visitors compared to a target of 14,200 with retail up 96% on the same period in 2010. Cable Car Museum retail also increased by 35% compared with the same period in 2010.
- Carter Observatory celebrated the 70th anniversary of the opening of the observatory on 20 December 1941.

Activities during the quarter

- The Museum of Wellington City & Sea opened Death and Diversity which explores the diverse rituals surrounding death through the experiences of different ethnic communities. The project was supported by Ethnic Affairs and the New Zealand Police.
- At City Gallery the Summer season included: Prospect: New Zealand Art Now, A Mobile Library and ARA-I-TE-URU.
- The cruise ship season started during this quarter and despite trying weather conditions promises to be successful for retail at the Museum of Wellington City & Sea and the Cable Car Museum, and the Māori Experience Tour at the Museum of Wellington.
- Carter's From Here to There: 1000 years of Navigation which was a series of three evening events achieved audience numbers of 250 against a target of 120 although general visitation for the period did not benefit from RWC.

Financial Commentary

- The Trust (excluding Carter) recorded higher than budget revenue in Q2 (\$141k favourable) and higher than budget expenses (\$138k unfavourable) resulting in a \$16k deficit (against budgeted \$24k deficit). This result was attributable in part to income from non-WCC grants being \$43k better than budget and trading income being \$59k better than budget. Operating expenses came \$121k over budget. This is a timing variance reconciliation of income/expenses with Te Papa for Oceania is not yet completed. The Trust still expects to be on budget for 2011/12.
- The Carter Observatory recorded an operating deficit of (\$11k) against a budgeted surplus of \$14k, due mainly to slightly lower than budgeted trading revenue (\$19k lower than budget)

Profile – Wellington Museums Trust

Wellington Museums Trust institutions are:

City Gallery Wellington, located in the Civic Square, creates a focus for contemporary visual arts, architecture and design in Wellington through local, national and international exhibitions including international exchanges and joint ventures with other art museums.



Capital E for children is a creative technology and performance facility in the Civic Square. It provides professional theatre for young people through Capital E's National Theatre for Children, hands-on creative technology learning experiences through its ONTV Studio and SoundHouse New Zealand, and stimulating holiday programmes and events

Museum of Wellington City & Sea is located in the historic Bond Store building on Queen's Wharf. The Museum strives to preserve, present and promote Wellington's social history and maritime heritage.

Wellington Cable Car Museum preserves and promotes Wellington's early cable car system, recognising its special contribution to the city's heritage. The Museum is located in the historic Winding House at the top of the cable car route.

Colonial Cottage Museum in Nairn Street was built in 1858 and is central Wellington's oldest identified building. It has been preserved and furnished to provide visitors with an experience of mid 19th century living.

Plimmer's Ark Galleries includes the conservation project of recovered timbers at Queens Wharf and in situ at the Old Bank Arcade.

New Zealand Cricket Museum is managed under an agreement with the New Zealand Cricket Museum Trust. Located in the historic stand at the Basin Reserve, this museum provides a special insight into the history of cricket in New Zealand.

Carter Observatory is New Zealand's longest-serving national observatory. With funding from the New Zealand Government, Wellington City Council, New Zealand Lotteries Grant, and the Pelorus Trust among others, a revitalised Carter opened its doors on 27 March 2010.
