# Second Quarter Report 2011/12 Financial Year

# **Highlights**

- Visitation for 2011-12 as at 31 December is ahead of target by 13734 visitors and ahead of last year's record visitor admissions by 7215 visitors
- We welcomed our 200,000th visitor to the Zoo for 2011 on Friday 23 December which was a massive stretch target achievement for the Zoo.
- Happy Feet and our capuchin, Doyle, were featured in the Dominion Posts top 20 photos that defined our city this year!
- Nyala lamb born October 16 and doing well this baby is the first in the Australasian region and importantly, it is female
- Our female Pygmy Marmoset also gave birth in early October. This is baby number two for this breeding pair. It's also a girl which is excellent for the breeding programme.
- Dr Lisa Argilla, Veterinary Science Manager, won the 2011 Wellingtonian of the Year Environment category
- The October School Holiday Programme was fully booked and was again a huge success and our holiday programme for the Christmas holidays also sold out in early November.
- EPA (formally ERMA) has given approval for twelve invertebrate species such as Giant Praying mantis', Burrowing Cockroaches and Scorpion to be imported to Wellington Zoo to be displayed in the upcoming Reptile Rotunda.

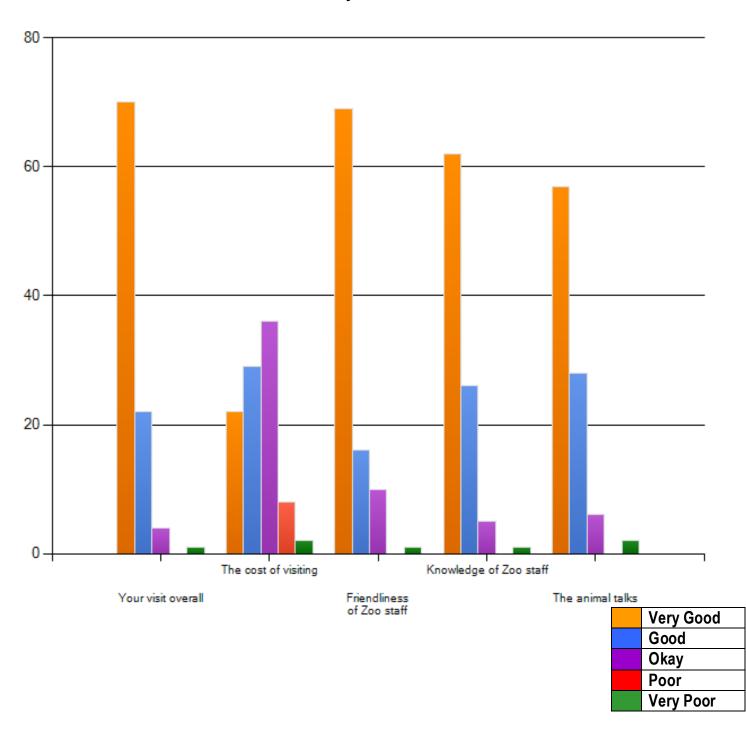

- We had a number of Volunteer corporate groups during the months of November through until Christmas (one per week).

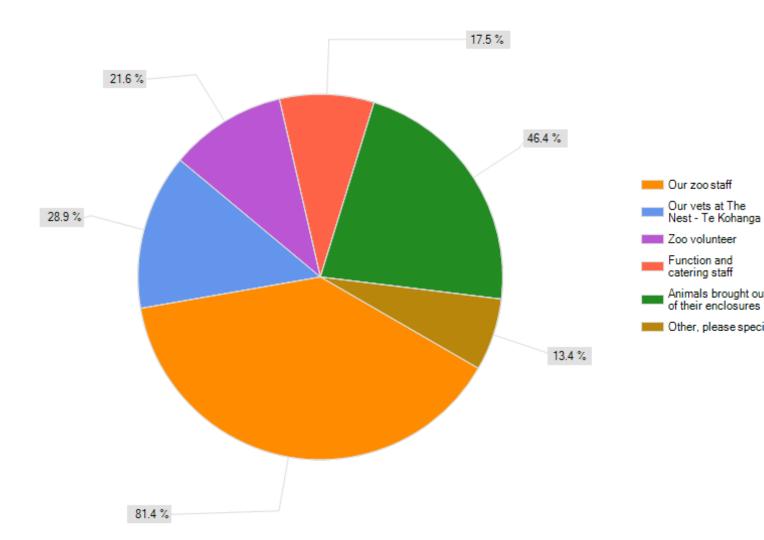

### 5. Commercial Development

### 5.1. Communication Highlights

- Machu and Picchu the pygmy marmosets welcomed their second baby in two years in early
  October and this was covered by the Dominion Post in print and online and by TV3 with a news
  story broadcast and online as well as an online photo gallery. Photos of the baby were also
  featured on the US website <a href="https://www.zooborns.com">www.zooborns.com</a> which receives more than 1 million hits per month.
- Manukura the white kiwi from Pukaka Mt Bruce spent several weeks at The Nest Te Kōhanga after swallowing several large stones. Stories about her treatment at the Zoo and at the Wellington School of Medicine were run by all major print and broadcast outlets in New Zealand, as well as in a number of prestigious overseas outlets including New Scientist, The Huffington Post, CNN and BBC.
- During October we gained more than 800 new fans and followers on Facebook and Twitter, taking our social media following to more than 8,300 people.
- Dr Lisa Argilla and Happy Feet featured in John Campbell's review of the media stories that defined 2011.
- The naming right auction of our newest female baby Pygmy Marmoset took place in December, and the Dominion Post and TV3 covered this story during December.
- The Dominion Post ran a lovely story about our Meerkats having a visit from Santa on the 24<sup>th</sup> of December.
- Happy Feet was #1 in the top ten animals of 2011 in the www.stuff.co.nz 2011 year in review.

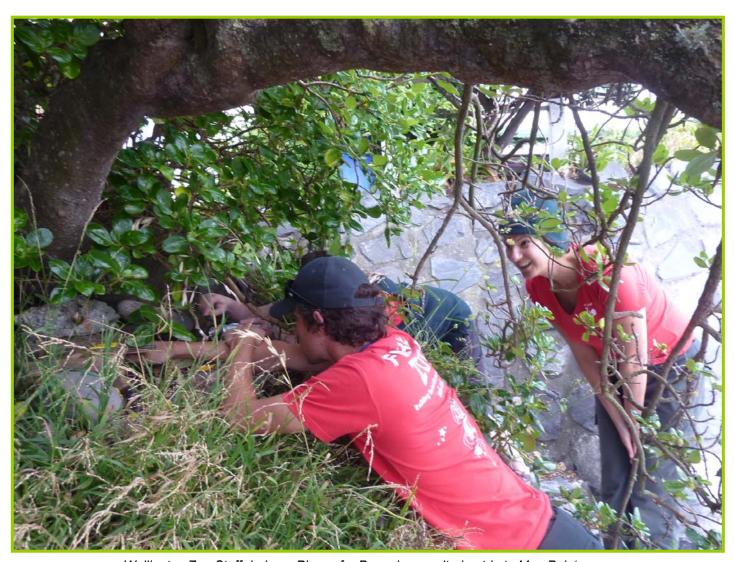
