## 1. OVERVIEW

The three month period under review generally represents the busiest period of operation for the Basin Reserve, as this is the period of heaviest cricket activity.

The Trust has been active as follows:

### **Trust Meetings**

The Trust met formally on 1 March, as part of its bi-monthly meeting programme.

### **Cricket Programme**

The period under review witnessed the bulk of the domestic cricket programme being played at the Hawkins Basin Reserve. Following a substantial drainage upgrade over the entire oval, interest was very high as to how the new field would perform.

It was very pleasing that the oval recovered so quickly from the drainage work, and that it played so well in the second half of the summer. The very good weather conditions provided excellent preparation conditions for groundstaff, which resulted in high quality surfaces and record scores and performances in some matches.

The venue also hosted the NZ v England test match in March. This much-anticipated game was curtailed somewhat on the fourth and fifth days due to rain, however the crowds were strong for the first four days of the contest, and the match presented extremely well on NZ and overseas television.

Following the cessation of the domestic playing programme there were several community-oriented cricket matches played. During the period under review the ground also hosted the local Gillette Cup secondary schoolboy final, between HIBS and Scot's College.

#### **Museum Stand**

The Trust has continued its dialogue with Council officers in regards to the options for the Museum Stand (which was not available for patrons during the England test match).

#### **Basin Bridge**

The Trust has been an active contributor to discussions and plans with the Council and NZTA as regards the proposed "Basin Bridge", nearby the northern end of the ground.

#### Winter Use

With the balance of drainage work to be completed immediately following use of the venue by AFL in late-April, discussions were held with the WRFU and OBU rugby club as regards the unavailability of the ground for club rugby in the winter. The works programme and the recovery time needed meant that the ground could not accommodate club rugby fixtures until, likely, August at the earliest. As this was the end of the club rugby season, the WRFU has approached its fixtures on the basis that the venue is not available this winter. It is still expected that the improved drainage will provide for higher winter use the following year, than has been the case in recent years.

### 2. OPERATIONS

## 2.1 Performance Analysis

### **Events**

- 3 x 4-day first class cricket matches
- 5 x 1-day first class cricket match
- 3 x Twenty20 first class cricket matches
- 1 x 5-day international test match

- 4 x international team training sessions
- 1 x local college match (Gillette Cup final)

## 2.2 Performance Measures

The actuals against budget are attached. Poor weather on the final two days of the test match negatively impacted the crowd numbers. The variance of event days against budget was mainly impacted by the unavailability of the venue pre-Xmas, when earlier it was budgeted that games and events could be scheduled immediately following the drainage upgrade. Poor spring weather however impacted that ability, with the consequent flow-on effect that events and event days remain under budget.
