NOTED:

- 1. Brook Turner addressed the Subcommittee on behalf of Zeal Education Trust in support of the grant application for Zeal. He noted the grant would help Zeal with moving its service to a new site with an aim to increasing its service capacity and ensuring the new location meets the needs of the young people who access Zeal. Mr Turner provided the Subcommittee with handouts detailing the new site and the Zeal service.
- 2. Allan Chambers addressed the Subcommittee on behalf of Harbour City Water Polo Club Inc in support of an application to partner with Berhampore School to ensure their school pool is able to be used by the Harbour City Water Polo programme. He noted the pool is currently in derelict condition and the additional money would go a long way towards restoring it for school, sports, and community access.

- 3. Holden Hohia, Samantha Tomaunui, and Chris Fox addressed the Subcommittee in support of the grant application from the Hoe Tonga Pacifica Waka Ama Association. They noted the grant would aid the association in logistics and organisation of their Matariki celebrations. The group added that their intention for their Matariki celebrations were to become a whole-of-Wellington event. The group provided the Subcommittee with a letter of support from Sport Wellington regarding their application.
- 4. Rod Alley addressed the Subcommittee in support of the Peace Foundation's grant application for financial support of the Wellington Peace Walk. Mr Alley provided the Christchurch Peace Walk as an example of how successful the event may be. He noted the Peace Walk is aimed at promoting Wellington as a peaceful city.
- 5. Hilary Beaton and Angela Green addressed the Subcommittee in support of the grant application from Downstage. The pair gave the Subcommittee a presentation on the history and vision of Downstage, in particular, the project that would be supported by the grant, 'Sound Stage'. They identified that the theatre is currently going through a cultural change where it has identified a gap exists in places for musicians to perform in Wellington. The 'Sound Stage' project would fill this gap by offering a venue and exposing new audiences to new emerging artists.
- 6. Gordana Vukomanovic addressed the Subcommittee in support of the grant application from the Yugo Sport and Art Association of Wellington. She noted the important relationship between sports and a developing economy and the significant role sport plays with the lives of children and young people. Ms Vukomanovic provided an email to the Subcommittee regarding her application.
