1. Alf Hazlewood, Funding Coordinator, provided the Subcommittee with information on Chinese Senior Community Incorporated. He noted that if successful, the grant funding would contribute to the running of a drop-in centre in Wellington. The organisation was founded by Juping Zhou in 2007 to support the increasing Chinese population and educate the community on Chinese culture. Mr

Hazlewood noted that Chinese Senior Community currently operates the drop-in centre, has a choir, holds regular and annual events that are well patronised by Chinese and non-Chinese members of the community, and participate in other community events.

2. Frances Lee from the Trelissick Park Group provided the Subcommittee with an update on the developments of their Kaiwharawhara Estuary work. She noted that the group have met with the Chief Executive of Centre Port who recognised the restoration work being undertaken around the area. Ms Lee noted that she has been in touch with Greater Wellington Regional Council who provided financial assistance that went towards some concept drawings by Boffa Miskell. Ms Lee noted that work could begin on the Kaiwharawhara Estuary in early 2010 but further delays would mean further damage to the area.

3. Hilary Beaton, Chief Executive of Downstage Theatre, discussed the application for grant funding towards the Theatre's Sound Stage project. Ms Beaton noted her previous work advising the Brisbane City Council through its arts advisory board and since her move to Wellington she has found it increasingly difficult to attain funding. Ms Beaton explained that the Sound Stage project is being developed to bring bands together to mix their sounds, providing artists with a venue outside of the current nightclubs and bars. She noted that Downstage is committed to paying professional fees for bands but is facing increased financial pressure by reduced funding from Creative New Zealand. She noted that Downstage is also intent on undergoing a capital works programme to upgrade the infrastructure and equipment available to performers. Ms Beaton expressed her confidence that the Sound Stage project will grow its level of self-sustainability as it progresses.
