#### **NOTED:**

- 1. Heather Timms representing Eko Theatre (application T1 Social) addressed the meeting in support of their application to the Social Grants fund. She advised the meeting that the Theatre is applying for funding for the "Be-Longing" which is a new inter-art work as part of the "Southern Corridor Project". Ms Timms said this project will be showcasing the artistic excellence, cultures, heritage and diversity within the Wellington region.
- 2. Vanisa Dhiru representing YWCA Wellington (application 28 Social) addressed the meeting in support of their application to the Social Grants fund. She explained that the "Y's up to Alcohol" programme is a self protection and harm reduction programme relating to alcohol consumption and abuse for young women, and promotes community safety. Ms Dhiru advised that they will be working other Community agencies in the delivery of the programme.
- 3. Linda Lim representing Asian Events Trust (application 4 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application to the Cultural Grants fund. She advised the meeting that the Chinese New Year Festival in 2011 will be the 10<sup>th</sup> year the Festival has been held in Wellington. The Trust is seeking funding from Council to enable there to be a programme of events which reflects all the traditional aspects of a Chinese New Year celebration.
- 4. Erin Todd representing South Side Markets (application 19 Social) addressed the meeting in support of their application. She explained that the South Side Market is a new organisation which has been born out of a need for more community involvement and a reduced need to travel for every day items. The intention of the market is provide quality, affordability and access to many items which include farm produce, fish, art and craft, local cultural items and much more.

- 5. Toni Huata representing Toni Huata Creations (application 54 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of her application. She advised that she is hoping to perform "Whiti Shine" during the Rugby World Cup in September and October of 2011 following the success of the album during Maori Language week.
- 6. Vicki Hirini and Lysianne Dela Ruelle representing Operation Restore Newtown (application 16 Social) addressed the meeting in support of their application. They advised the meeting that the focus of Operation Restore Newtown is on restoring the environment and meeting the needs of socially isolated individuals who live and gather in the community areas in Newtown and surrounding areas. Ms Hirini believes that the need for this project was first identified by the many agencies working with disaffected members of the Newtown community and to date there have been positive results.

(Councillor Ahipene-Mercer left the meeting at 10.24am.)

- 7. Kylie Aitchison representing the New Zealand Comedy Trust (application 30 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application. She advised that they are seeking funding from Wellington City Council for the salaries of the Wellington based employees. Ms Aitchison commented that the Comedy Festival for 2011 is intended to give Wellington audiences the diversity and high quality comedy which is on offer during the New Zealand International Comedy Festival.
- 8. Mary Laine and Vaune Mason representing the Overactive Imagination Co-op (application 38 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application. They advised the meeting that they are seeking funding to stage a production "Monster Burlesque" during the Rugby World Cup in 2011 which is to be held at the Paramount Theatre. They stated that the performance is going to be a show which has never been seen in New Zealand.
- 9. Nick Bevin, Chair of the Friends of Futuna Charitable Trust (application 20 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of the Trusts' application. He advised that the Chapel will be 50 years old in March 2011, and a weekend of celebration is planned. Mr Bevin commented that the event will inform the public of the history of the chapel and promote the use of it as a community facility.

- 10. Angela Green representing A Slightly Isolated Dog (application 1 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application. Ms Green advised that the application is for the development of a production to be part of the Downstage Theatre "Presenting Partner" programme.
- 11. Laura Preston representing Adam Art Gallery (application 2 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application. Ms Preston advised that the Adam Art Gallery application is for a series of "soundart" performances at various locations in the city. She commented that by doing the "In Our Name: The Commons Project" will bring focus on the Adam Art Gallery which is located at Victoria University's Kelburn Campus.
- 12. Gary Stewart representing Enterprise Miramar Peninsula Trust (application 2 Economy) addressed the meeting in support of their application. Mr Stewart advised the meeting that the residents and business owners on Miramar Peninsular would like to increase the awareness of the area as a place to visit, live and work.

Mr Stewart further advised that the Trust wishes to develop printed material and a website to enable the telling of the unique story of the area.

- 13. Will Goldsmith and Toni Huata representing Poneke Te Ora (application 41 Cultural) addressed the meeting in support of their application. They advised the meeting that the project aims to provide a showcase of local established and emerging Maori performers and artists. They also commended that they aim to deliver three 80 minute shows during the Rugby World Cup in 2011. They further advised that the shows will feature Maori waiata, poetry, story telling, waka and arts.
- 14. Abdul Akramy representing Afghan Association of Wellington (application 1 Social) addressed the meeting in support of their application. Mr Akramy advised that the Association would like to ensure the continuation of Afghan language, cultural values, sense of history and to promote the understanding of their origins with this project.

Mr Akramy stated that they have run a successful programme in 2010 and advised that the teacher is unable to continue on a voluntary basis.
