

The Patrol can provide operational support, welfare assistance and high-visibility community reassurance.


Overview

- Purpose: Acting as the 'Eyes and Ears' of the Police and the Tawa Community.
- Aims: Working collaboratively with our community and partners to be highly visible and crime prevention focused.
- The Patrol is affiliated to Community Patrols of New Zealand (CPNZ) and has operating partnerships with Police, Wellington City Council and the Red Cross.
- The primary focus for the Patrol is the Tawa area (including Grenada North, Takapu Valley and Linden).



Standard Operations

- The Patrol has an active membership of 35 volunteer patrollers.
- The Patrol operates mobile, foot and static patrols:
 - Day Patrol: Operates mid-week day patrols.
 - Night Patrol: Operates patrols on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.
 - Community Events: Supporting local events and community initiatives.
- All Patrols are logged in with Police Communications/Command Centre (with the ability to communicate directly) and have at least two patrollers on duty.




The Patrol Car is the base for all patrol operations and is highly recognisable across the community.

Resourcing

The following equipment is carried in the Patrol Car:

- Electronic Reporting System (to log incidents and details)
- Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
- Emergency External Light Bar (flashing amber/alley lights)
- o General Medical First Aid Gear
- In-car Recording and Audio Camera
- General Fire Extinguishers
- Road Cones (with access to more road cones at our Tawa Community Centre Office).





- The Patrol is capable and deployable to provide support to partner agencies in emergency situations. Examples include:
 - Natural disasters (earthquakes, severe weather): reassurance and high-visibility patrols, reconnaissance, welfare checks, logistical transport and traffic control.
 - Large Scale Incidents (fires, road blockages): traffic and crowd control, high-visibility patrols and welfare checks.
 - Missing Person Searches: search capability and reassurance.
- Patrol deployments for the above situations are based on patroller availability, situational realities and patrol resourcing.
- Depending on the emergency situation, the Patrol maintains communications with Police, Tawa Fire Brigade, Red Cross and the Wellington Emergency Operations Centre.
