- 3. It's a carpark on a busy road and too close to the landfill.
- 4. It's exposed to both southerlies and northerlies, has no views and doesn't get much sun.
- 5. The likely development and maintenance costs, as with all council initiatives, is likely to be astronomical and if it's user pays then the charges will be too high for a substandard location.

In summary - it's a desolate, exposed, sunless, isolated carpark on a busy road. Why would anyone want to pay to stay here when the south coast is so much more dramatic and appealing and has awesome views?





On behalf of Owhiro Bay School I wish to oppose the amendment to the Suburban Reserves Management Plan which would allow camping as a managed activity on Happy Valley Park.

The proximity of the proposed camping area to Owhiro Bay School raises the following concerns/ issues in relation to student health and safety;

- Increased traffic due to cars/vans going up and down the road and potentially more parents dropping their children to and from school.
- Potential exposure to less than desirable behaviour for those students walking past the site on their way to and from school

The money proposed for developing this site would be better spent on improved facilities at places (predominately Princess Bay and Ohiro Bay carparks) where freedom campers already stop. These improved facilities would then also be available to the ratepayers who are financing them! 3. High charges will simply deter freedom campers from using prescribed facilities anywhere in Wellington, and if coupled with an aggressive enforcement regime, will ultimately deter these people from staying in Wellington for any length of time, to our economic detriment. 4. SIMON CRAGGS - ALLOWING CAMPING AT HAPPY VALLEY PARK

I'd like to start off by saying that I am backing this project 100% and I think it's a great move by the Council to offer lower cost accommodation options for overseas travelers coming to Wellington. Especially with the growing trend of travelers spending more time in Wellington and bearing in mind there is a British & Irish Lions tour coming in 2017.

Furthermore I'd like to make some suggestions regarding the planning and implementation of the project and its potential impact on the local community.

On-site manager/caretaker.

There is no doubt about it; this camp is going to be busy. With potentially 120 people utilising the site on a daily basis this is always going to raise issues that an on-site manager will be able to deal with on an ad-hoc, hands-on basis. Inevitable toilet blockages, campfires, rubbish overflows, cleaning issues and potentially small disputes are best dealt with by someone who is there at the time and not someone who is available via a 'hotline' or by someone that turns up once or twice a day to check for non-payers. This isn't going to be the equivalent of an outback DOC site where a pay as you go scheme and honesty box system will work. And as such the newer system proposed for this site utilising sensors in the ground is a very smart option. But I believe there is a lot to be said for a human presence: a host, a warm welcome, from a fellow traveler that's also a local, from someone who can answer questions on this that and of course, the other. Someone steeped in The Wellington Way.

Also, having an on-site manager or site leasee would also give the option of having a manned telephone line for bookings and availability enquires.

I feel that the local community would feel a lot safer and more confident about the campsite if there were someone on–site 24/7.

A small relocatable house (or large portacom style building/caravan) could be utilised to house the manager - this could easily be moved if the project was to be relocated or scaled up/down.

Public transport link improvement.

The Happy Valley Road site that has been earmarked for this project is in my opinion very suitable. However the bus services that cover this area are very, very limited. The #4 bus only runs early morning and early afternoon (commuter bus hours) with no weekend service at all. And the #29 runs most of the day but only runs as far as Newtown and again has no weekend service at all. The majority of campers staying at the site will no doubt want to visit the city so they should be able to do this via public transport instead of adding to the congestion and parking issues that the city already faces by driving into town. I believe campers should be encouraged to leave their vehicles on–site whilst they visit the city and either walk, cycle or bus into the city and on these current timetables taking the bus is not really much of an option.

I would like to see an extension of the #29 route to include a city drop-off or adding a few daytime routes to the #4 route as well as a weekend option for one or both. The only other alternatives are taxis (probably more than a low-budget backpacker can afford) or walking for 20 minutes to Island Bay or Brooklyn. The latter is a good alternative but as we all know, Wellington's weather isn't always 'walking friendly'. I feel it's important to mention that an increase to the bus services from Happy Valley Road would also benefit the whole Owhiro Bay community as well as the campers.

Ongoing engagement with the local community.

Due to media exposure, backpackers have a pretty bad reputation for being untidy & disrespectful to the environment and the places they stay. I think it would be great to try and reverse this negativity by initiating some community/camper integration. I think it would be helpful to show the community that in general it is 'the few' spoiling it for 'the many' and that most campers are in fact, respectful, tidy people. Locally hosted talks and walks by members of the community for campers, story swaps, coffee evenings and adding an 'annex' to the Mokai Kainga: Owhiro Community Garden* are just some of the things I would like to see happening.

*A small 'un-camp-able' section of the area could be set aside for the growth of produce. Mokai Kainga could potentially sell or ask for donations for their produce to help fund their 2 community gardens projects.

Our property is unique in that is consists of three vertically stacked shipping containers, which although well insulated, the noise from motorhomes and their guests would be highly disruptive to our guests. One of the main reasons why guests stay at our property is that it is private, quiet and away from other people. This would of course no longer be the case if there was a camping ground opposite. We are also very worried about security. As the house is very unusual we already get people trying to gain access to look around. We feel that having a campsite opposite would only add to this problem as more people would then see it and be curious. As the whole purpose of this proposal is to move campers, and the problems associated with them, away from other properties, naturally we do not want to experience these problems ourselves. Even with a site manager we cannot see how these problems would disappear. Aside from the fact that our property is directly opposite the proposed site, the location really doesn't make much sense to us. Having rented motorhomes ourselves before, we would only choose somewhere with a pretty outlook. The proposed site is not pretty, and is some distance away from the water. The southerly also whips up the valley which is hardly ideal for tents. You want tourists to leave Wellington with a decent impression of it's beautiful scenery which they wouldn't with this site. I have a number of concerns with the proposal - set out in the comments section below. However, my primary concern with an amendment to the Suburban Reserves Management Plan is that freedom camping could be allowed at the site from summer 2015 / 2016. At the moment, with the exception of self contained camper vans, the site is completely unsuitable for freedom camping. There are very limited toilet facilities onsite and no kitchen or shower facilities. Permitting freedom camping to occur on that site before the site has been properly developed (with ablution and kitchen blocks, adequate lighting, rubbish collection, signage etc) will cause a detrimental impact to the local community similar to the impacts seen at the red rocks parking area last Christmas: noise issues, traffic issues, rubbish issues, waste water issues, inadequate toilet facility issues, overcrowding leading to freedom campers parking on the road etc.

Any proposal to change the Reserves Management Plan should prohibit freedom camping until the site is properly developed with sufficient toilet and ablution blocks, kitchen facilities, adequate lighting and rubbish collection. It is not acceptable for the Council to come up with a short term solution to the problem of overcrowding at Red Rocks car park by shifting the problem elsewhere in the Owhiro Bay community. The proposal should be delayed until the results of restricting freedom camping at Red Rocks are known - and whether freedom camping at the site can be adequately managed with minimum disruption to the local residents. The Council should do more research with other local councils that offer significant freedom camping in their areas to learn more about how best to manage the sites.

I have a number of objections to the proposal in its present form. These are: - What impression of Wellington does this site offer for freedom campers: it is important that all visitors to Wellington have the most memorable experience that the city can provide. In my view, this site would be unlikely to provide an optimum experience for freedom campers. The site offers no easy transport options - there are limited bus route options. To reach the cbd, you will ever need to drive or walk to Island Bay or Brookly to catch a bus. There are no shops nearby. The site is not particularly attractive. It is exposed and windy. In my view, it is not the best site for giving a great impression of the beauty of Wellington to freedom campers. It smacks of finding a cheap and easy place to put them. - Traffic: the site is very close to the Murchison Road intersection. That intersection is difficult at the best of times. There are a considerable numbers of school and kindy children walking along that road every school day. I am extremely concerned about the increased risks of large number of cars and campervan exiting from the site. - Risks of freedom camping happening immediately: For the reasons set out above, I am very concerned that the proposal will permit freedom camping from this Christmas. The site is not capable of supporting freedom camping there at the moment without adverse impacts on the local community. The stream: the local community and school has been working hard to restore and beautify the stream. I am very concerned that large numbers of people on that site will have a negative impact on the stream and natural environment there. Noise: the area surrounding the site is residential. There is the potential for freedom campers to be arriving at that site late at night. This is going to have an impact on residents' enjoyment of their homes. No economic benefit to Owhiro Bay: there are no shops near the proposed site in Owhiro Bay. Any shopping the freedom campers need to do will be done in either Brooklyn, Island Bay or the CBD. It seems to me that Owhiro Bay is being asked to share the burden that increased freedom camping may bring but there is no economic return to the local community / residents from doing so. The community is stretched: we already have one freedom camping site. There were a number of difficulties with the site last year. We are now being asked to take on another site. We are a small community - it seems a lot to ask when there are a number of other potential sites around the city. In my view, Owhiro Bay has been picked because it is a cheap and easy option for the Council. If the Council is serious about providing facilities that offer a memorable experience for freedom

campers, they should explore the other possible site options if more detail.

Please find attached my submission on the proposed camp ground on Happy Valley Park.

Regards, Matthew Kyne 15a Murchison Street Island Bay I oppose the placement of the freedom camp site on Happy Valley Road. I am strongly opposed to any freedom camping at this site this summer.

The concerns are have are broken down as follows:

- Reduction in useable open space
- Increase in noise
- Increase in traffic
- Increase in traffic hazards
- Increase in risks for the Owhiro Bay Community
- No benefits for the local community

Reduction in useable Space

As a resident I cannot send my children to play safely at the Tawatawa Reserve due to its status as an off lead dog exercise area. I would not feel comfortable sending my children down on their own to the playing fields if a camp site was nearby especially if there is no on site 24/7 management.

The proposal to introduce a camp site by the Happy Valley playing fields reduces the unsupervised safe and large open green space options for young people in the Owhiro Bay community to zero. Furthermore the camp ground could "potentially" encroach on to the playing fields in to the future and will take away further precious open space from the Owhiro Bay community. If the proposal goes ahead how does the council plan to protect the remaining open paying field space in the immediate vicinity? My understanding is that further public consultation will not be required if the council decided to expand a camp site into Happy Valley Park in the future. So should the Councils Happy Valley proposal be declared more accurately to reflect the council's future intentions of using the playing fields at Happy Valley Park? This is not clear in the current proposal and I suspect that people in

Increase in noise

the community may not be aware of this.

Owhiro Bay is a family orientated suburb in a country setting. That is why I choose to live here. It is very quiet at night and I would like it to remain that way. The proposal will result in a regular and significant population injection. Some of these visitors are unlikely to have the same appreciation of our peaceful environment and this will cause significant disruption and alter the vibe of the Owhiro Bay community. Other current Freedom camping sites in Wellington are in the CBD and Evans Bay. These sites are not in quiet locations. Why ruin a key feature of this suburb?

If the proposal was to go ahead – how would the Council mitigate the increase in noise from the camp ground?

Increase in Traffic

The introduction of a campground would mean a significant increase in traffic in the area. This will be compounded by the fact that there are limited facilities in the immediate vicinity so travel by vehicle for supplies will be required resulting in multiple trips for campers through residential areas.

Increase in Traffic Hazards

The main road is very dangerous. In the area is a challenging intersection, with blind corners and a stretch of road that is already heavily policed due to speeding. Reducing the speed to 50Km/h may help but a lot more would need to be done to slow traffic by the entrance to the proposed site, for example, changing the intersection at Murchison Street and introducing traffic calming measures. The council will need to invest a lot more to make it safe for all road users including cyclists and pedestrians. Currently there are no safe to cross options for kids going to and from school in the Owhiro Bay area. There is also no street lighting in the lower parts of Murchison Street.

What is the councils plan to make the stretch of Happy Valley Road and the intersection safer? How is the council going to mitigate the risk of a campervan entering into Happy Valley Road on the wrong side of the road and potentially causing a serious accident?

Increase in risk?

I believe that the likelihood of the risks described below occurring is high and the council must demonstrate an appropriate level of mitigation for each risk.

There will be a significant increase in rubbish and human waste and this will have the potential to pollute the nearby stream. How does the council plan to mitigate this environmental risk?

There is the potential that campers may use water from the polluted stream. How does the council plan to mitigate this risk?

There is a risk that campers may hunt for long fin eels in the Owhiro stream. How does the council plan to mitigate the risk of illegal hunting of these eels that are in decline?

There is the potential for undesirable behaviour at the camp ground. How does the council plan to mitigate this risk?

There is the potential for pedestrians walking past the site to be exposed to this undesirable behaviour. How does the council plan to mitigate this risk?

There is the potential for pedestrians walking past the site to be in increased danger due to traffic movements? How does the council plan to mitigate this risk

There is the potential for Happy Valley Park to be repurposed as a camping ground. How does the council plan to mitigate this risk?

There is the potential for "free riders" taking up residence outside the camp ground and parking in surrounding streets and utilising the camp ground facilities. How does the council plan to mitigate this risk?

There is the potential for more campers to be wanting to camp at this site than can be accommodated. How will the council mitigate this risk?

There is a potential over flow from the Te Kopahau Reserve as restrictions are enforced. How does the council mitigate this risk and where will the campers be accommodated later this year?

Benefits to the community

I cannot highlight any benefits to the Owhiro Bay community.

The planned capital and then ongoing operating investment from the council is unclear. I can only assume that it if it is low cost accommodation the council would not be looking at investing large sums of ongoing operational funds to manage a campground 24/7 that this site demands.

Perhaps the Wellington City Council should work with other local councils to form a suitable campsite or use existing campsites in the region.

I will not be making an oral submission.

Here is my feedback on WCC Proposal for Freedom Camping on Happy Valley Park and other places around Wgtn.

I regularly enjoy camping and tramping in Wellington and I am a campervan owner (not self-contained). I have travelled overseas campervanning extensively around wider Europe, Scandanavia and Russia for extended periods of time over a number of years. I used to live and work in Island Bay. I now live in Hataitai. I have worked in Owhiro Bay for over 10 years and have recreated there for even longer. I am involved in a lot of the conservation and regeneration work being done in the Valley.

Camping in tents:

I love camping in New Zealand and find the Department of Conservation and local Council camping areas on the edges of parks and reserves around NZ fantastic. I do not think that camping is required within cities. If people want to go put up a tent and go camping then they can leave the city and go camping. People do not expect to be able to put up tents in cities, instead they book into accommodation.

I don't think that the providing of free or cheap campsites in Wellington adds to the economic benefit of Wellington. Many of those using free or cheap campsites are trying to live on very little money (for a wide variety of reasons) and are not spending significant money in Wellington. I think that the reverse is actually the case – that if free or cheap campsites are <u>not</u> provided then these people do still visit Wellington and that they book into accommodation in or around the city, providing economic benefit!

Campervan park & Campsite size:

Providing campsites and campervan parks forces people to congregate in these areas and it is when people congregate that the issues arise. These can be issues of noise, rubbish and inappropriate behaviour. When vehicles or tents are just in ones or twos, then this group mentality behaviour does not occur. So, I believe that the numbers congregating together should be kept to a minimum and that this will significantly reduce the likelihood of and frequency of issues arising, thus reducing management costs and environmental impact.

Self-contained campervans & Non-self-contained campervans (incl cars/vans with beds):

Carparks with public toilets:

Wellington has a lot of public toilets with carparks near to them. Allowing small numbers of campervans (both self contained and non-self contained) to park near to public toilets for a couple of nights should, in my opinion, be allowed. It should be clear stated that no waste (including washing up water) is allowed to be put onto the ground or environment (eg tipped in trees). Currently, many public toilets are locked from late at night to early in the morning. Basically, most people don't use the toilets between 11pm and 5am (or thereabouts) as they are sleeping, so I don't think that this matters much. However, it may be that the presence of campervans around means that these toilets no longer need to be locked during these night hours.

Other carparks:

I think that self-contained campervans could be allowed to park in some other carparks without toilets that are not used greatly overnight.

Restricted Hours Campervan Parks and Restricted Vehicle numbers per carpark:

I suspect that the number of campervans allowed in each carpark should around 2-8 campervans. I think that campervans should only be allowed to park from 7pm to 8am (or similar) and only for 2 nights at any one carpark with a total of (eg) 4 nights parking allowed in Wgtn. Restricting the parking times means that the carpark is not taken over by campervanners (and as they are meant to be tourists it encourages them to explore our city). At some carparks the hours might need to be different depending on the local use of the area. The plan would be for the area to be used by campervanners after the business of the day has subsided. Restricting the number of nights means that people are not taking advantage of permanent free accommodation, but they can explore Wgtn in 5 days and then move on or get a more suitable permanent location.

I believe that 'restricted hours' campervan parks are essential for success as they will reduce the likelihood of and frequency of issues arising, reduce management costs and environmental impacts – while increasing the ecomonic benefit of these tourists to Wgtn.

I also think that carparks right next to the toilet blocks, walkway entrances or other features should be left free of campervans and always available for locals and visitors to use. Campervans can be large and intimidating and when people have chairs and tables out they can appear to 'take over' areas. I think it is important that the carparks that can be used by campervanners are clearly designated in appropriate places and that they can also be used as regular carparks.

<u>Drinking water taps</u>: I think that public toilets should also have taps to provide drinking water. I think that this is a good for locals, not just tourists. I think that the taps should be of a type that allows a drink bottle to be filled from them. This also encourages people not to use the hand basins to fill drink bottles which can reduce cross-contamination from hand washing and toileting.

Other facilities:

I definitely do not think that dishwashing facilities, hot water, sink benches, sheltered seating or other kitchen facility should be provided anywhere. If people do not have facilities in their vehicle then they can visit a supermarket, restaurant or takeaway shop and buy suitable food. If people need a shower, then they can visit a swimming pool facility or outdoor beach showers. Dumping stations clearly do need to be provided in a few locations, but I believe that there are currently sufficient around Wgtn.

Rubbish bins – It's always difficult to have big enough rubbish bins, yet not become a spot for locals to get rid of their rubbish too. It will need to be managed.

Te Kopahou Reserve Car Park:

It's appalling. Local residents and members of the public using the carpark and coastal area have been negatively affected. Rubbish is regularly left behind by overnight users. Some rubbish is blowing away. The Marine Reserve is being negatively affected. Are you even allowed activity by a reserve that negatively impacts on the reserve?! Overnight users are toileting on the sides of the building and on the beach area. It's often noisy. Often the overnight users are loud late at night. Overnight users appear to 'take over' the area making other users of the area feel less welcome. It's not managed or very poorly managed. Just saying that 'the Council is learning about freedom camping and is making changes' is, in my opinion, not good enough. There is plenty of experience in the world and in NZ about running camping areas and campervan parking. It is not necessary to learn it all again from the beginning by trial and error. Instead, research and consult with those with the experience and propose to implement plans that may need 'tweeking', not developing.

Overnight users appear to be tourists primarily making use of a cheap accommodation option. They do not appear to be tourists who are primarily looking for scenic spots to overnight in and to enjoy the views and local environment.

Te Kopahou was trialed. Lots of issues have been identified. They have not been solved. Yet it has not been closed! Instead, apart from some more regular visits for rubbish pick up, not a lot appears to be being done. 'We're working on a plan to make changes' is not good enough. It's a mess and a really bad advertisement for a clean green environmentally friendly NZ. Close it, and if or when there is a good plan, then open it again for another trial.

It makes me shudder to think that the type of camping/campervanning option that has been available at Te Kopahou is going to be expanded to other parts of Wellington – together with the same people 'managing' it. Please get people experienced in developing and managing other campsites involved throughout the planning and managing stages.

Management of Sites:

It is hard to comment on what I think should be the level of management in terms of daily visits or on-site manager in general, as I believe it would differ depending on the type of site. However, I have the following basic levels of expectation.

Management levels should start of much higher than is expected to be necessary and then be reduced after a year if possible – and definitely <u>not</u> the reverse of increase management as everything fails. Set up for success. Instill the campervan/camping culture desired from the start. Be heavy handed if necessary and set the standard. Encourage social media and freedom camping sites to include lists of 'rules' and be sure that the people whom we want are the ones being attracted.

I don't believe in having places for tents in Wellington, however, if you did then I think this should have a permanent on-site manager.

I don't believe in having campervan overnight parking sites without time restrictions, however, if you did then I think this should begin with on-site managers and that these should be reinstated at busy times of the year (even if not used at other times). The rest of the time there would need to be someone patrolling regularly and probably remaining on site for some time at busy times to encourage/assist people to set up appropriately — it all gets too hard if you try to take action when something is already set up or parked wrongly.

I think that people given the responsibility of managing sites must have the authority to implement and enforce the rules, not just security people. I gather that currently this would require more Park Rangers. I think that fining by issuing tickets probably has limited impact due to the fact the offenders are likely to be tourists, and that chasing tourist fines can be very expensive. I think that fining campervan companies is more likely to have success, but that it won't deal with all people/vehicles. I think that wheel clamping should be considered, as if people are aware that breaking the rules will result in wheel clamping and a hefty fine, then they're less likely to break the rules, as their vehicle is important to them.

Other camping sites have forums for sharing information about undesirable people. Using this information and sharing WCC information with others, should be a part of any management plan – and rules should state that those banned/reported from other sites won't be accepted. Campervanners from NZMCA acting as hosts should be considered once excellent site standards have been implemented and management is going well, as long as these people are backed up by quick responding enforcement.

Social Media & Media

I heard a lot of talk about the power of social media from the Council, and about the great way that people are getting to hear of sites very quickly via social media. However, I have not heard talk about how the Council have used social media to improve management of sites. Have the Council posted about better adherence to the rules being required and to acceptable site standards, about

what the rules and standards are, about the site being full and that people should look outside Wgtn, about the issues of rubbish, noise, marine reserves, toileting etc and solutions to visitors for these?

Social media does have power and so using it proactively needs to be part of any management plan, as would using all media, Council publications and pamphlets, websites, local newspapers and tourist publications.

Happy Valley Park Site

My answer is 'no'. I am not in favour of allowing camping as a managed activity as part of Happy Valley Park.

I am never going to be in favour of the plans suggested as they allow for tents, kitchens, expansion, no on site management, large numbers, etc.

I would be likely to change my mind on allowing a few campervans to park their overnight with time restricted parking from 7 or 8pm to 8am if the Council could first demonstrate successful management of Te Kopahou first. These campervans would need to be managed in line with the suggestions that I have given above including time restricted sites and number restricted sites.

Consultation

I thank the Council for ensuring that the public had some time for consultation and for Council staff for making themselves available as part of this. As yet plans for the Happy Valley site could still change markedly before implementation, and if something does go ahead on Happy Valley Park, then I think that the Council should make the opportunity to consult with the public again on the finer details. This is only round 1! I think that the Council has heard many excellent ideas from the communities and submitters and that the Council should come back with these ideas, researched, included where suitable and developed into plans for round 2!

I also think that the Council should open this issue up to the rest of Wellington and put some informative information from all points of view and including the suggestions (like time restrictions) in the local newspapers and Council publications.

Firstly, I am concerned at the order and timing of the need to change the Plan. Surely it would make sense to confirm resource consent and funding first, however it became clear that the council are rushing the submission process through to enable freedom camping this summer. I am alarmed that the issues that occurred over summer and still remain at Te Kopahou Reserve (Red Rocks quarry) will now happen at Happy Valley Park instead.

Furthermore the school is a hub of our community so the timing of the process is frustrating given that the information came out in the last weeks of term 3 and closes at the end of a two week holiday break when our community is not in it's usual rhythm.

Submission on changes to Happy Valley Park to become a camping ground.

I wish to oppose the change in plan to make the current Happy Valley car park site into a low cost camp ground on the follow grounds.

Burden on community

The Owhrio Bay community of 400 odd households has already embraced freedom camping in the Te Kopahou Reserve. This area will have 12 berths, and this represents about 12% of the total freedom/low cost vans that require nightly stays in Wellington (The consultation document states about 100 vans require berths each night).

The proposal to have an additional 33 berths for vans, mobile homes, and tents would take the Owhiro Bay's community's contribution to about 50% of the total berths required for the whole of Wellington city. This is a disproportionate and complete unfair burden on a small semi-rural community. It is not fair that this small community has to take on this burden for the whole of Wellington when we are already contributing with the Te Kopahou Reserve.

The size of the impact on the valley of Owhiro Bay is significant. There are about 120 houses on Happy Valley road from the current car park to the sea. The addition of 33 effective residences to this community is huge and unacceptable, roughly a 30% increase in population for the valley area.

Noise

The public meeting raised the issue of noise pollution and the impact that it will have on the community. Unlike the other sites in Wellington which area either by the sea or in the case of the Te Kopahou Reserve, by the sea and at the end of the road, the car park site in in the bottom of a valley in close proximity to residential housing. The valley, being semi-rural in nature is generally quiet, but the addition of 33 more effective residences in a natural bowl of the valley will cause noise pollution. There is already evidence from the other camp sites of noise issues but in the case of the happy valley park car park site, the only place for the noise to travel is to the local housing disrupting the local community - both in the valley and on the hills.

Visual disruption

Unlike the other freedom or low cost camp grounds in Wellington, this ground will not be situated amongst like type activities. The Evans Bay ground is situated on a mix use site, the Te Kopahou Reserve once reduced to 12 berths is at the end of the road and has lowish visual impact on those beyond close to the entrance and the harbour camp ground is right next to other car parks. This is not the case with the proposed Happy Valley camp site. For those across from the site and all those in close vicinity, either on the hills or in the valley it will be a big visual disruption. I doubt the council would be happy putting a car sales yard at the site, but the visual impact from the new proposed camp ground will be the same.

proposed site so they can use the facilities. We could well have a situation like what has occurred at the Te Kopahou Reserve where over 60-70 vehicles were using the area.

I would also expect that the presence of the camp ground would have a chilling effect on the usage of the park by the local children. I cycle home by the park and often see kids playing with kites or balls on the park. It is likely parents may feel uncomfortable about sending their kids down to the park to play knowing there is a large and unmanaged camp site next door.

Environmental impact

The camp site is situated in a wind effected part of the valley and this will impact on the management of rubbish created and left by the campers. At the other sites and from comments from those present at the public meeting we would expect rubbish issues and that would mean rubbish blowing into the stream, and down towards the school or up towards the horse reserve area. The injection of 33 berths and probably 50-80 people per night will have significant environmental impacts with rubbish and waste

The stream is already somewhat polluted with the leaching from the tip and isn't a good place for people to swim and take dips. There would be a concern about oil run off from vehicles and any leaks from them impacting on the wider local environment and the stream. Both the council, the Owhiro Stream restoration group and the local school have focused a lot of energy on bringing the stream back to life and it would be sad to see the impact of this camp ground causing that work to be undermined.

Lack of onsite management

I have already referred to the lack of any comprehensive onsite management as part of the proposal. The current proposal seems to suggest a programme of infrequent visits by either a Park ranger or security service. If the proposal goes ahead, this would be completely unacceptable. The provision of 24/7 onsite management would help to reduce the negative impacts of some of the areas that have been outlined in this submission.

From my perspective it would not make me support the proposal as there are just too many issues that on-site management can't address but it would mitigate the negative impact.

Decision making process issues

Consultation period and timing

The timing for the announcement and consultation for this decision are concerning and showed lack of good faith by the council. The initial announcement was made during the school holidays in June 2015. The consultation period was mainly over the school holidays in late September and early October 2015. Both of these time periods reduced the ability of one of the key impacted parties, the school and its community to be able to the part of the process. This is a time when our teachers and parents in the community are taking holidays and a large number are away or unavailable so can't be involved in a discussion.

I work for the Department of Conservation and a large number of the staff are campers, a number and commented that they also would not expect freedom camping sites to be provided in the city and that campers could easily use places like Catchpool DOC camp site and then travel into Wellington when needed or use car parks and stay at the Youth Hostels.

Other options for Happy Valley car park

What is disappointing about the proposal and the management of the current car parking area is that the community is being offered and Hobson's choice. We have either;

- An unmaintained area with limited community utility the car park is in very poor state and not even great for car parking.
- Or an upgraded area as a camping ground that the community can no longer use and that imposes significant impact of the community.

Sadly the council has not come forward with any other options such as properly maintaining the area and beautifying the close vicinity to increase the utility value of the space making it a more accessible community and regional space. For limited investment it could easily be turned into a more family friendly picnic type area.

Summary

In summary, as a small community we are already doing our bit to support camping and Wellington tourism with the camping site at the Te Kopahou Reserve. Asking us to take on nearly 50% of the campers in Wellington is an unfair burden. The knowledge that in the future this site could well increase as it is the "easy" option for the council is also alarming.

I strong oppose the move to change the Happy Valley Park car park into a camping site and suggest the council look to other parts of the Wellington region to take the fair share.

I would like to make an oral submission to the council on this proposal.

I oppose the development of camping facility in Happy Valley.

Previously I was neutral with regard to the plan, and considered that much of the opposition was of the NIMBY variety, but after reading the proposal in detail it became clear that what's proposed doesn't adequately seek to give any benefits to the local community (Happy Valley and Owhiro Bay).

Other suburbs might benefit economically from increased tourism but this community can't because it has no shops. There will be an increase in traffic, noise, and the site will only have spot checks. Indeed, at the evening talk in the kindergarten officials could name no benefits at all other than helping the broader city. Helping the city is a noble idea, but on this single issue the proposal is 'all take and no give'.

I suggest that you come back with another proposal that has something in it for the local community. The unique problem of a lack of shops in this community means that the council needs to come up with a custom bespoke solution, and not apply rules or justifications that make sense in other suburbs.

I suggest that you investigate raising the price by 30% and giving that money to the school. Raising the cost from \$10/per-person to \$13 shouldn't deter campers, and the school is a communal area used by many in the community.

Please note that I do not wish to speak in support of my submission, and ask that the preceding submission be fully considered as-is.

General comments about the proposal

This submission is made to Wellington City Council (WCC) on behalf of the Southern Environmental Association (SEA).

Following the problems encountered in Owhiro Bay last summer (2014/15) as a consequence of central government's freedom camping legislation, SEA generally supports WCC's attempt to find a suitable site for campers within the city. However, SEA's support for the proposed site at Happy Valley Park is conditional on certain very specific provisions, outlined in this submission.

In particular, SEA strongly opposes the suggestion that freedom camping could be permitted on this site during the coming summer (2015/16).

Issues raised by the proposal

SEA has canvassed the views of its members and people in the area and the concerns raised included:

- the likelihood of noise, litter and pollution, especially in the adjacent Owhiro Stream
- the likelihood of erosion and other potential damage being caused by campers descending into the stream bed
- the loss of parking for other users of the park, especially at weekends
- the likelihood of freedom camping being permitted during the 2015/16 summer.

Noise, litter, etc

If the campground is properly managed, we believe that problems of noise, litter and pollution should be no greater than at any other urban campground or caravan park in New Zealand. However, at almost all such sites, there is a *full-time*, usually resident, manager. We believe that a full-time manager is an *essential* provision for the proposed campground.

Provided there is a full-time manager, we believe that it would not matter greatly whether the campground is operated by WCC or by a private company (and in any case, WCC would ultimately be in charge as land owners).

We note that there is no apparent provision in the plans for accommodation, or even a small office, for the manager. An office will be required as a minimum, but for the manager to be truly full-time, there should be provision for on-site overnight accommodation.

Erosion, etc

SEA notes that, in the WCC proposal, there is provision for continuous planting along the perimeter of the campground. As well as slightly reducing the impact of Wellington's winds, this will go some way towards preventing litter being blown into the stream, but we suggest that the provision of a wire mesh fence between the new trees and shrubs and Owhiro Stream would further reduce the amount of litter escaping into the stream and would also discourage campers from going down into the stream bed.

In the interests of protecting the natural environment (and the considerable amount of effort invested by both WCC and the Friends of Owhiro Stream over the years, planting trees in this area), we suggest that the provision of such a fence is *essential*.

Loss of parking area

The use of the existing parking area will have a considerable impact on the weekend users of the park who come from all parts of Wellington to participate in sports fixtures.

We presume that weekend users will have to park on the road. Happy Valley Road is quite narrow and with parking on both sides and its proximity to the end of a 70km/h zone, there will be a considerable safety problem, especially with the number of children who take part in weekend sports activities. (There is a separate WCC proposal to reduce the length of the 70km/h zone, but its acceptance cannot be taken for granted at this point.)

We can see no way of completely eliminating this particular problem. However, some steps can be taken to reduce the danger:

- in conjunction with reducing the speed limit in part of the current 70km/h zone to 50km/h, WCC could implement a temporary 30km/h limit around the entrance to the sports fields; this speed limit could apply only when the sports field is being used, reinforced by flashing speed limit signs that operate only at these times
- WCC could provide alternative off-road parking for sports field users.

Other possibilities, such as road-widening, or the provision of parking spaces off the main thoroughfare, may well be impractical, but if they were possible, they would go some way towards improving the situation.

Freedom camping in 2015/16

We understand that there is no way any campground development can be undertaken before the coming summer. A WCC go/no go decision is scheduled for late November 2015 and then, if the proposal is approved, a resource consent will be required — if that is granted, there will then be a few months' construction work. We would expect it to be a tight timeframe to have work completed even by late spring in 2016.

However, in a throwaway comment on page 5 of the proposal document, WCC notes, "If camping is permitted at this site, then freedom camping can occur this summer 2015/16." This is unacceptable, and in our view it would undermine the whole proposal.

Submission from Southern Environmental Association on the Happy Valley Campground Proposal

We have already seen the problems that resulted from freedom camping at Te Kopahou Visitors' Centre, where a combination of large numbers and the poor behaviour of a very small minority of campers resulted in a miserable summer for some Owhiro Bay residents.

If WCC allows freedom camping at Happy Valley Park while the formal proposal is going through due process, there is a real risk that it will generate such opposition to the proposal that it will never get a chance to prove that it *can* work, even when subject to the provisions we have already mentioned. Residents may see all their worst fears confirmed and will not be sympathetic to a future "non-freedom" campground, even if it is extremely well run and causes very few problems.

Summary

SEA **strongly opposes** the proposal to operate freedom camping at Happy Valley Park in 2015/16.

SEA **conditionally supports** the proposal to operate a fully-managed camping ground, subject to the provisions that:

- · users pay an overnight fee
- there is a full-time manager (essential)
- · the manager is accommodated on-site
- there is substantial fencing around the campground (essential)
- WCC takes steps to reduce significantly the risks to weekend users of the sports field if they need to park on Happy Valley Road.

In the event that WCC opts *not* to have a full-time manager at the campground, SEA would **oppose** the proposal in its entirety.

Friends of Owhiro Stream (FOOS) appreciate the opportunity to submit on this proposal and look forward to constructive engagement with Wellington City Council in resolving the issues we have raised.

Friends of Owhiro Stream (FOOS) think that there is insufficient information has been provided in this proposal to allow the Owhiro Bay community to make a considered assessment of the impacts of establishment of a camping ground at Happy Valley Park.

The consultation documents appears to propose amendments to the Suburban Reserves Management Plan (SRMP) allowing establishment of a camping facility on reserve land, specifically at the Happy Valley Park. Given the supplied timetable, it also suggests that approval for managed activity status for the campsite establishment will be sought from the Environment Committee in late November 2015.

Given that this proposal envisions that freedom camping will commence on the site this summer (2015-16) we can only assume that planning process for this activity is well advanced. It is our understanding that the SRMP requires any application for a managed activity approval will provide relevant information including:

- a description and/or plans of the proposal with enough detail to determine all potential effects
- an assessment of the impacts the development/activity will have on the immediate and wider environment
- the purpose of the proposed development/activity and why it needs to take place on the reserve network
- an explanation of how the development/activity is aligned with the objectives and policies in this plan
- details of other approvals or consents required (eg if consent is required under the Resource Management Act 1991)
- consultation with affected parties
- identification of health and safety issues and how these will be managed

Given that this level of details is not provided in the community consultation documents, we feel somewhat on the backfoot in our understanding of the thinking and planning that has gone into this project. Our following comments are therefore made on the basis of a lack of relevant information and hope that the Council Officers and Environment Committee ensure that this is corrected in further community consultation and before any final decisions are made.

Lack of detailed information

- No substantive analysis is evident for the likely scale of requirement for this camping activity. On one hand, the consultation document suggests that self-contained motor homes and campervans are well catered for in Wellington City. The ongoing requirement for non-self contained camping is not quantified. This is concerning as future camping site expansion potential is indicated in the proposal but no upper limit is suggested.
- No explanation has been given for the selection process of the Happy Valley Park site as the preferred camping site for Wellington City
- We see that day-to-day management of the proposed camping ground will be critical to its success and acceptance by the community. We are aware of difficulties in the previous arrangements made for the Te Kopahou Reserve carpark but do not see evidence that WCC has committed sufficient resources to ensure that issues are avoided at this new site.

Environmental concerns

The proposed site for the camping ground directly adjoins one of our Owhiro Stream restoration sites so we have a keen interest in any activities that may have negative impacts on the stream's ecology.

No acknowledgement is given to the close proximity of the proposed campsite to the stream and we are concerned that the following issues might arise from the campsites establishment:

Rubbish

Campers not carefully managing their rubbish and it being carried by the wind into the stream. We also have some difficulty with fly-tipping in this area and would not like this issue being exacerbated.

Disturbance of stream environment

The layout plan shows vegetation creating a level of containment around the camping site. Given the very exposed nature of the site, establishment of this barrier could take some time and may need to be supplemented by fencing if both shelter for the site is to be provided and access to the stream environment is to be managed.

Stormwater management

Patterns of use on site would suggest that contamination of campsite surface and hence any stormwater runoff is likely to occur. As there is no separate stormwater network in this area, this stormwater would be discharged directly into the stream. Given the potential impacts on the stream environment, particularly from detergents and oils, we would suggest that careful design and stormwater treatment features will be required for this site.

Interference with wildlife

Given the fragile balance of the stream's ecosystem, human impacts can be significant. For example, if campers start feeding the birds, larger populations of ducks, seagulls or pukekos could be attracted to the area. This pressure could be detrimental to the stream environment.

General Comments

Traffic issues

Road access to the designated camping area is close to the 50kph to 70kph speed limit boundary on Happy Valley road. We have noted the care needed when turning from Murchison Street onto Happy Valley Road and would suggest that the proximity of the campsite access to the speed limit change needs to be investigated as a traffic safety issue. This is particularly important if foreign tourist drivers are involved. Traffic management for sports field user vehicles displaced from the existing carpark also need to be considered.

Site Accessibility

Public transport access to the site seems poor. The Southern Shopper bus (#29) has very limited frequency. There seems to be an implicit assumption in the proposal that campers will be travelling in their own vehicle.

Project timing

We believe that the timetable outlined for the establishment of the campground is unrealistic in terms of the detailed planning and community consultation that still seems to be required.

Viability of the campground

Given the proposed size of the campground we have to wonder about the economic viability of the activity. For this activity to be successful and to integrate well with the community it will require committed resources from the Council.

Subject: Happy Valley Campground

To whom it may concern

I am writing in support of the Wellington City Council proposal to establish a campsite at Happy Valley.

According to MBIE data, Holiday Parks currently represent around 20% of the commercial guest nights market in New Zealand, peaking to around 27% of the market over summer (Dec-Feb). Wellington city's current campground facilities, operating at 100% occupancy 365 days a year, could only provide perhaps 6-7% of the city's guest nights. While the city is unlikely to become the kind of long-stay summer holiday destination campgrounds thrive on, it seems reasonable that there is potential in offering more options to this visitor segment.

Wellington's key tourist drawcards are attractions like Te Papa, Zealandia, Wellington Zoo, plus our retail sector, bars, cafes restaurants and the waterfront precinct. The vast majority are located in our walkable CBD and inner suburbs. However, for tent and motorhome visitors, there are limited options in close proximity to the city and its attractions.

The Wellington Waterfront Motorhome Park is in a prime CBD location, however has a capacity of 39 spaces currently and is likely to be reduced following relocation next year. Operating at +90% capacity through the summer months, it clearly indicates a demand for motorhome camping in central Wellington, (to say nothing of tent demand) which it cannot supply singlehandedly.

In Petone, the TOP 10 Holiday Park in Petone is also an excellent facility, with ample capacity and a variety of tent and motorhome options. However, it is comparatively some distance from Wellington city, and those key attractions, decreasing the potential economic benefit of these visitors to the city.

The provision of 'freedom camping' spaces has also served a particular market segment. However, unbookable and offering few support facilities, these primarily suit visitors who are price-sensitive, on limited budgets and happy to be flexible in their travel planning.

I believe an opportunity exists in Wellington for a medium-cost, bookable campground catering to both campervans and tents. Such a facility, as proposed at Happy Valley, would be, in my view, a welcome addition to current operations. It would provide a 'middle ground' between the WWMP and the TOP 10 in Petone, plus provide better forward planning and additional facilities as compared with freedom camping.

By establishing this facility we will broaden our appeal to the holiday park market, and increase our capacity to host them.

On the secondary question as to whether or not the Happy Valley Campground should have an on-site manager, this would require market comparison of pricing structures resulting from either approach. However, the most important consideration, whichever approach is taken, is we are able to offer a quality experience to visitors, to ensure positive reviews, recommendations and return business.
