HEARING STREAM 1 – STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Summary of key points to highlight in the statement of evidence of Christine Foster dated 3 February 2023 (for Meridian Energy Limited)

- 1. Meridian's submissions reflect the company's particular interests in the WCC PDPP:
 - How the PDP provides for and affects Meridian's existing assets;
 - How the PDP provides for upgrading and enhancing the generation capacity of Meridian's existing assets; and
 - How the PDP provides generally for new generation and new renewable energy generation technology (including solar).
- 2. This last point above is of particular interest given the planned transition to a reliance on renewable energy sources advocated by:
 - WCC itself (through the PDP and Te Atakura);
 - GWRC (RPS Proposed Change #1); and
 - The Government (in its emissions and REG targets to give effect to international obligations and respond to climate change).
- 3. I participated in discussions between Meridian and WCC policy staff during development of the draft PDP and assisted with some drafting suggestions some of which were adopted in the PDP.
- 4. Meridian's submission focuses on the few areas where officers did not take up suggestions made and most of those are subjects addressed in future hearings (primarily the Infrastructure Hearing Stream) which Meridian representatives will attend to address you directly.
- 5. I am largely in agreement with the s. 42A reporting officers for Hearing Stream 1.
- 6. There is one point of difference and that is really a matter of emphasis: in Objective SCA-O1 where I propose explicit reference be made to the role that renewable electricity generation will play in the transition away from fossil fuels.
- 7. This is detailed on page 7 of my statement (paragraph '6' noting that the paragraph numbering should read '5.4' and again on page 12).
