## Wellington City Proposed District Plan2022: Hearing Stream 1 – Strategic Direction: Hearing Statement for Horokiwi Quarries Limited (submitter reference 271)

Horokiwi Quarries Limited ("Horokiwi") writes in relation to Hearing Stream 1 - Strategic Direction that is scheduled to commence on Tuesday 21 February 2023.

There are a limited number (four original and 1 further) of submission points of relevance to Horokiwi that are being considered as part of Hearing Stream 1 and on that basis, Horokiwi has not requested to be heard or filed evidence. That said, Horokiwi is available to respond to any questions the Hearings Panel may have.

In response to submission point 271.16 seeking a new strategic objective, Horokiwi is fully supportive of the S42A report recommendation for the provision of a new strategic objective relating to the benefits of quarrying activities. As outlined in the introductory text to the Horokiwi submission, quarrying activities (outside the Special Purpose Quarry Zone) have a challenging role in the PDP. Despite their resource dependence and functional constraints, and necessity in enabling infrastructure, they are not recognised as 'Infrastructure ' within the PDP. While Horokiwi supports the provision of a specific Quarry Zone in the PDP, the plan does not address the absence of policy recognition within the PDP of a new quarry site, or expansion of an existing site outside the Quarry Zone. Given the importance of quarries to the city and region, Horokiwi would support policy recognition outside the Special Purpose Quarry zone, and specific to the strategic objectives, the provision of a strategic objective which recognises the benefits of mineral utilisation. Such policy recognition would be consistent with the Greater Wellington Regional Council Proposed Natural Resources Plan Policy 12A, and the Regional Policy Statement Policy 60. Horokiwi notes there are no further submissions to their submission point 271.16.

Howokiwi notes the recommendations on submission points 271.2 and 271.3 (seeking wider policy recognition for quarries in the PDP outside the Special Purpose Quarry Zone) refer back to the recommendation for a new strategic objective (refer above recommendation on 271.16) and do not specifically address the sought policies. Horokiwi anticipates the relief sought in these two points will be further addressed in Hearing Stream 7 (Hearings stream 7 – Rural and Open Space, District Wide Matters, Special Purpose Zones) along with

submission point 271.4<sup>1</sup> (which also sought a new policy outside the Special Purpose Quarry Zone). Horokiwi supports such an approach as it allows the bulk of the Horokiwi submission to be addressed comprehensively at one hearing.

The S42A Report recommendation on the remaining two submission points (S271.12 and FS28.2) relevant to Hearing Stream 1 are supported.

For completeness Horokiwi records its position in respect of the relevant matters in the attached table.

Horokiwi respectfully requests that this letter be tabled for the Panel's consideration, to confirm its position in relation to its submission points and the Section 42A Report recommendations.

## Attachment 1: Horokiwi Quarries Ltd position in response to s42A recommendations, Wellington City PDP Hearing Stream 1 – Strategic Direction

271.3	Whole PDP / Whole PDP / Whole PDP	Considers that there is currently no plan wide recognition of the need and benefits of quarrying activities. While the General Rural zone provides one specific policy (GRUZ- P6), it relates to effects as opposed to the benefits of quarry activities and therefore is limited in its scope. While the Special Purpose Quarry Zone has a policy (and rule) framework it relates to existing quarry sites within the Special Purpose Quarry Zone only and does not have plan wide application, including for any expansion of existing quarries outside the Quarry Zone. Horokiwi suggests that the most logical place for some form of plan wide recognition of quarrying activities would be within the Infrastructure Chapter. However, it is recognised the quarries are not infrastructure as defined in the PDP. As such, as an alternative Horokiwi would support the policy recognition in other parts of the PDP (outside the Special Purpose Quarry Zone). Add a new policy within the PDP (outside the Special Purpose Quarry Zone) as follows: <u>The benefits of quarrying</u> <u>activities to the city and region are recognised</u> and provided for.
