Kia ora Jamie Thank you for your email.

I really appreciate your work on this.

I agree with your proposed mapped area of the 'Moa Point Road Seawall Area'.

My one issue would be the name as Moa Point Road goes all the way to Breaker Bay Road. But thinking about it if there are seawalls in the future, to protect the road, they could be called 'Moa Point Road Seawall Area B'

The mapped area is good as it shows the extent of seawall construction at present and possible areas where seawall construction may be required at the Lyall Bay (eastern end) and Moa Point Beach (western end). It also protects the Natural Open Space Area on Lyall Bay and Moa Point Beach.

If this plan is accepted by the Panel, it provides a good plan for some elements of Wellington International Airport Ltd Appeal of HS1-5 as they are still talking about the Seawall from Lyall Bay to Moa Point.

Kia ora, Yvonne.

As a result of the matter you raised about further clarification needed for the area of seawalls near the airport, I've had the attached maps prepared. These maps are intended to be (subject to the Panel's decision) included in the District Plan to identify the area of the coastal margin where the policies and rules are more enabling of works to maintain and upgrade the existing seawalls.

Can you please provide any feedback you may have on the boundary/extent of this area – that I have called the 'Moa Point Road Seawall Area'.

Note:

- The seaward boundary is consistent with the Coastal Environment Overlay boundary which uses a determined MHWS. As MHWS is dynamic it doesn't always line up with the aerial imagery used for the online mapping.
- The zoning is based on parcel boundaries which is why it does not align with the overlays/MHWS.

- The landward extent of the area intentionally goes to the centreline of the road as road takes on the zoning of adjoining parcels

If you could please provide any feedback by end of Wednesday 5th June at the latest that would be appreciated.
