Purpose

1. To give an oral presentation of the 'A Seed and a Wish' report to the committee and provide an update on progress made with the Urban Agriculture Portfolio.

Summary

- 2. The 'A Seed and a Wish Urban Agriculture in Wellington' report suggests that the council work to improve the visibility of urban agriculture around the city and make urban agriculture accessible to the wider community by:
 - Setting up a council Urban Agriculture Taskforce
 - Including edible planting in green space around the city and create a fruit tree programme.
 - · Establishing an Orchard Trust
 - Incentivising community composting
 - Promoting urban agriculture and local food around council.

Officers recommend that the Community, Sport and Recreation Committee:

- 3. In March 2012 the Strategy and Policy committee passed the two following resolutions:
 - 1) 'Agree that council takes a facilitative role of the city's community gardens through Parks and Gardens and City Communities teams.'
 - 2) 'Agree that officers work on the opportunities and options for developing a more strategic approach to the city's food sector and urban agriculture of which community gardens are an integral part'.
- 4. An urban agriculture portfolio in community services was created in July 2013 to take on a facilitative role for the community gardens and to develop a more strategic approach to the food sector and urban agriculture.
- 5. 'A Seed and a Wish Urban Agriculture in Wellington' is a student intern report written to help identify what is happening in urban agriculture Wellington wide.
- 6. The above suggestions were made in response to this student report.
