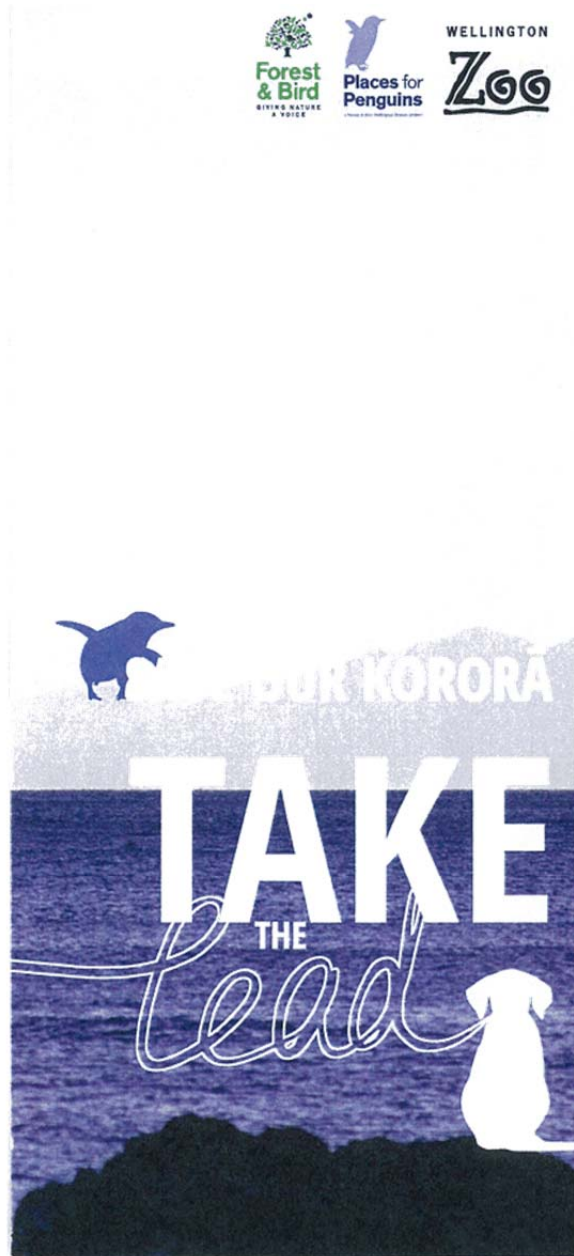

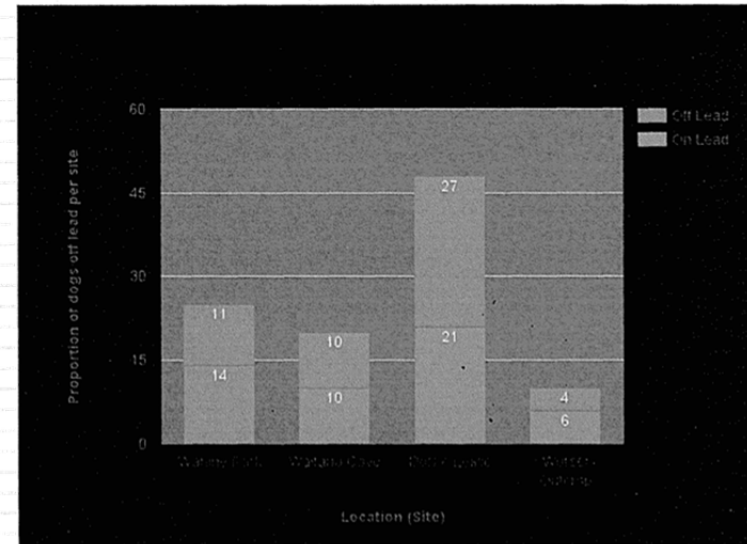
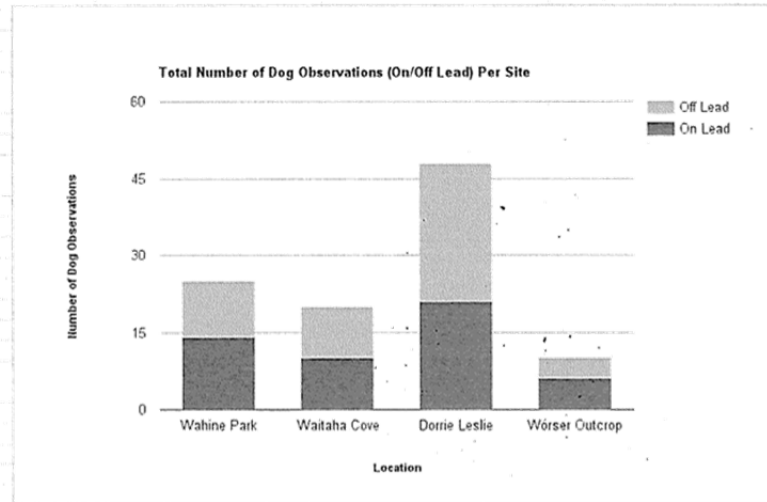
Submission

1. F&B PfP considers that Councils Dog Policy review needs to achieve greater protection for at risk wildlife, particularly in coastal areas.
2. Councillors need to appreciate that:
 - significant wildlife and dog control related issues require management,
 - the policy issues are wider than just dog exercise area designation, and
 - a comprehensive review enabling wildlife and canine interests to safely coexist will enhance Wellington's reputation as a progressive, eco-city.

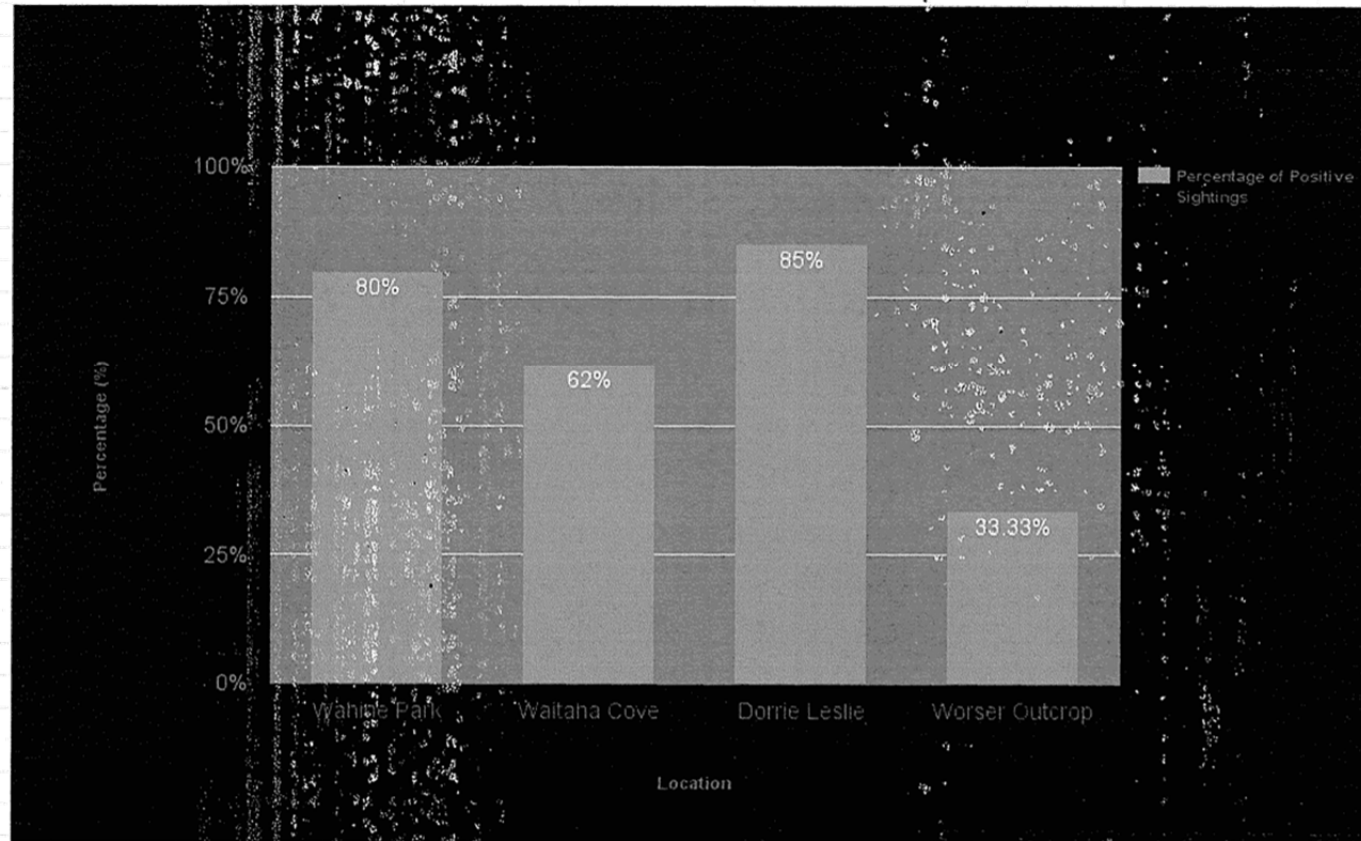
Key points

3. Wellington is the only capital city in the world with a resident little penguin population. The little penguins living amongst us are really threatened by the largely urbanised environment around where they breed.
4. There are areas around our harbour where wildlife require a higher priority. There are also areas where, with planning and communication, dogs and wildlife can safely co-exist.
5. WCC's dog-control measures can be readily improved through:
 - website information that is easier to access and more consistent,
 - on-leash and off-leash area signage that is more prominent and coherent, and
 - by-laws that are designed and managed in ways that make them a meaningful deterrent.
6. F&B PfP welcomes Council's Dog Policy review. We wish to work collaboratively with the review team and dog owner interest groups on wildlife priority areas, regulatory framework improvements, and on information and communication enhancements.

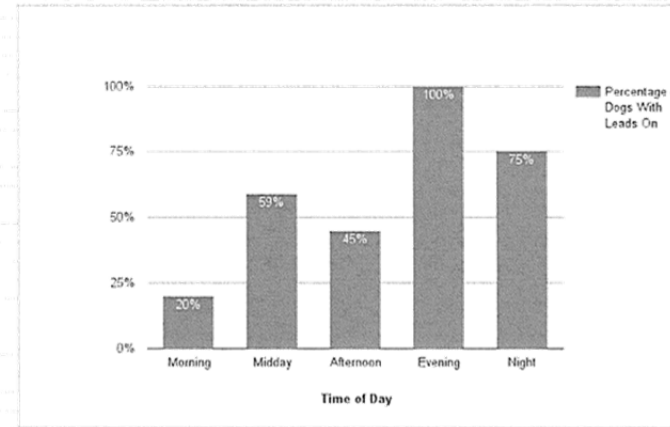

Little penguins largely nocturnal on land

Little penguins come ashore to breed - they have strong nesting area fidelity
 their young will also use the same area once they reach breeding age

50% of chicks will not survive their first year

Little penguins must be waterproof to spend up to 18 hours per day in the sea to feed themselves and their chicks
 They come ashore to shed all their feathers and grow new ones during a catastrophic moult ashore lasting approximately 2 weeks

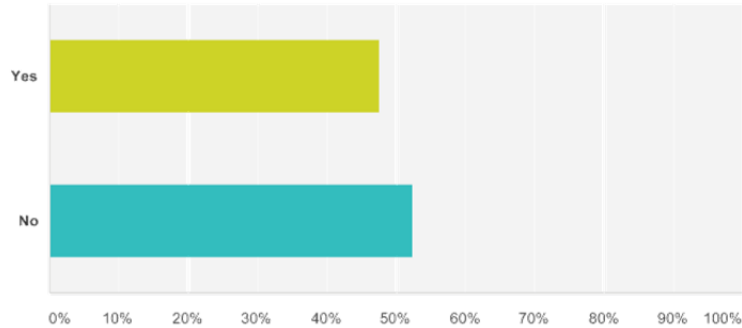

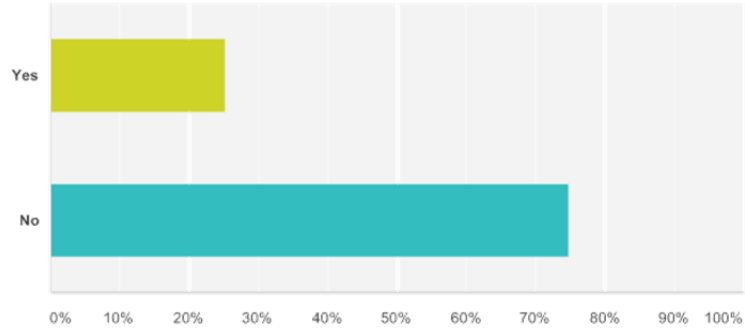

Q8 Have you ever noticed one of these boxes on the coast? (show photo of nest box)

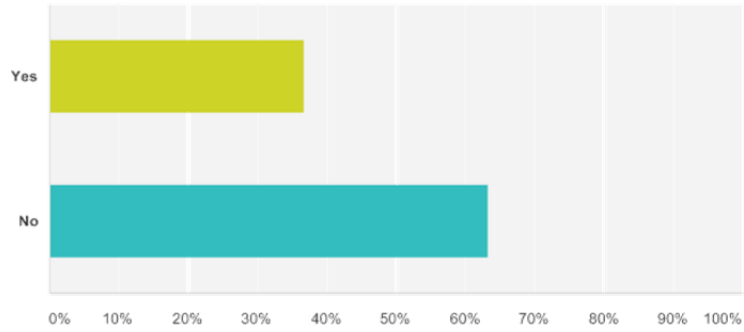

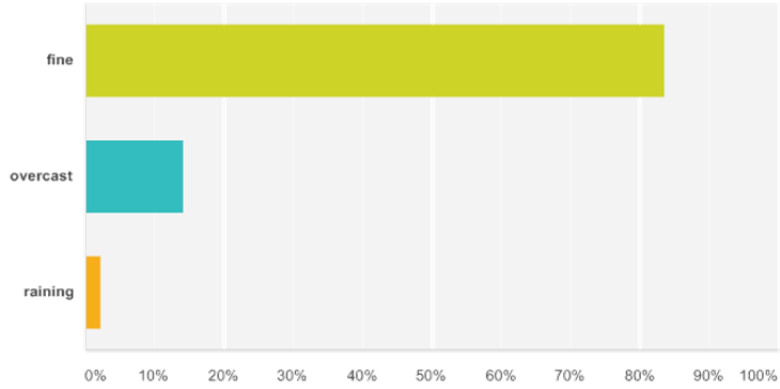

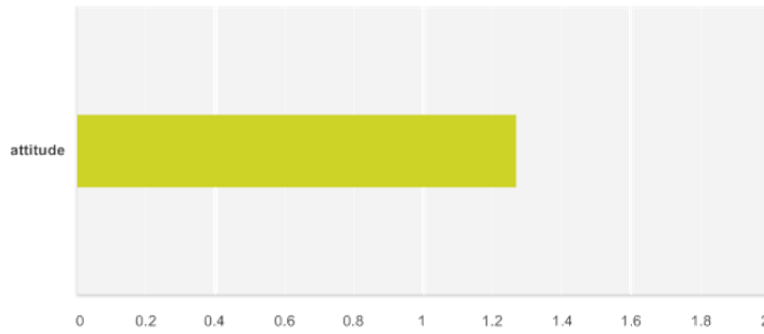

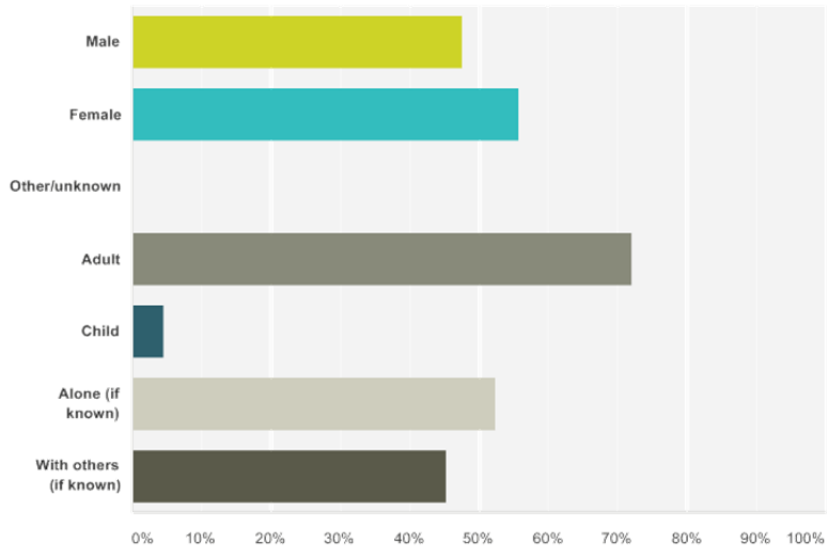

Owhiro Bay Campground comment, Environment Committee, Thur. 26 Nov. 2015

Good morning Madam chair, your worship and councillors. First, I would like to commend the council for the work to date on this proposed campground but I believe there is still room for further consultation.

Reading through this "REPORT" there are several issues highlighted which I believe still require further diligence and investigation. This is BEFORE the S.R.M.P. can be amended "to allow camping as a managed activity".

- As it stands at the moment, this proposed new campsite would offer NO local benefits to the Owhiro Bay Community.
- You have stated this would NOT be a suitable site for "Freedom Camping" and given that we already have two FREEDOM sites at Red Rocks and Evans Bay, we do NOT need another FREEDOM site.
- The fact that there are going to be tent sites means that ANY NEW SITE, will require management. What's to stop people from up and leaving?
- Given the new campsite's location within the Wellington city boundary, campers will be only too happy to pay a nightly fee for this convenience.
- At Owhiro Bay, given the proposed size of this new campsite, who's to say that if successful, the size of this is not increased to include the playing fields south of this park down to the school boundary.

THEN THE RESIDENTS, WOULD BE UNHAPPY. This is not a desirable outcome.

Any campsite is "GOOD FOR TOURISM" no matter where it is. It's not just in certain suburbs. And any additional campsite will "HELP MANAGE FREEDOM CAMPING" but not if it too, also becomes a "freedom campsite".

From page 130, I believe that option #4 (WITH AN AMENDMENT) should be the preferred choice. This decision amendment should in fact be delayed to April, after daylight saving has finished.

I believe there are other sites that could be considered.

One that comes to mind is the grassed, MT. ALBERT park before the Hockey stadium on Russell Terrace. This is above, and across the road from Martin Lucky park.

If Mt. Albert was "removed" from the the list of available playing fields, then it would solely become a camp ground destination.

YES, there is a gun club there beside Mt Albert park but they have their own car parking. And if there's NO firearms stored onsite, then this too, would NOT be an issue.

Mt. Albert park would indeed tick all the boxes of "Concerns" that currently exist for the Owhiro Bay site.

- This new site, is indeed more suitable for a campground
- It's up a barely utilised drive so traffic safety is no longer an issue, nor is parking
- There are facilities in a building beside the ground already, which could also be expanded
- This proposed site is not overlooked by local residents, nor is there a school nearby
- There would be less noise control issues or worry of local residents feeling unsafe
- If rubbish and recycling bins are provided, then the environmental impact would be nil
- As for locals benefits, economically these would be much better.
 - a) The roads already carry buses so motorhomes would be ok on these roads
 - b) There's a supermarket and other stores 1.5 km down the road
 - c) There's a bus service runs past the entrance
 - d) The zoo is a 10 minute walk away
 - e) We could offer a new convenience store that would be far better patronised because of the campground, gun club and hockey stadium users. Also, Houghton Bay and Southgate residents may also avail themselves of this new facility, given it is on their way home and is a lot closer than Island Bay.

Given the level of these concerns from Owhiro Bay residents for this proposed campsite., I think that it would be prudent for this council to in fact DELAY THIS PROPOSED AMENDMENT while other options are indeed considered.

This would allow for the council to collaborate with all Southern Ward communities for their input, to investigate and come up with another option. An option that IS better and addresses the "concerns" as mentioned from your report.

I do not need to name them but there have recently been decisions delayed or made, by this council which have caused some, if not a lot of divisiveness amongst, and within our neighbourhoods and communities.

We are NOT, against the campground but what we do not want is another rushed decision that will again divide a community.
