# ROAD CLOSURES

# Purpose

1. This report asks the Regulatory Processes Committee to approve the temporary closure of roads to enable events to take place.

# Summary

- 2. Applications have been made to temporarily close roads for the following events:
  - *Polish Christmas Market*: Saturday 17 November 2018, Rain Day Sunday 18 November 2018.
  - *A Very Welly Christmas*: Midnight Saturday 24 November 2018 to Midnight Sunday 25 November 2018.
  - Thorndon Fair. Sunday 2 December 2018, 6am to 6pm.
  - *Black Caps V Sri Lanka*: Saturday 15 December 2018 to Wednesday 19 December 2018, 6am to 10.30pm.
  - *Black Caps V Bangladesh*: Friday 8 March 2019 to Wednesday 13 March 2019, 6am to 10.30pm.
- 3. Under Schedule 10 of the Local Government Act 1974, the Council is required to approve these closures. Authority to grant these approvals is delegated to the Regulatory Processes Committee.

# Recommendation/s

That the Regulatory Processes Committee:

- 2. Note that recommendations in this report should not be amended without first carrying out further consultation with affected parties and verification from the Council's Traffic Engineer that the amendment is not likely to cause unreasonable impact on traffic.

- Lambton Quay (Whitmore Street to Willis Street).
- Ballance Street (Old Bailey side entrance to Lambton Quay).
- Stout Street (Ballance Street to Lambton Quay).
- Waring Taylor Street (Intersection Maginnity and Waring Taylor to Lambton Quay).
- Johnson Street (Wilson Carpark to Lambton Quay).
- Brandon Street (Half way on Brandon Street to Lambton Quay).
- c. Thorndon Fair Sunday on 2 December 2018, 6am to 6pm
  - Tinakori Road (between Bowen Street and Harriett Street).
  - Hill Street (between Tinakori Road and approximately 100 meters east).
- d. Black Caps V Sri Lanka from Saturday 15 December 2018 to Wednesday 19 December 2018, 6am to 10.30pm:
  - Slip Lane (Buckle Street to Kent Terrace).
- e. Black Caps V Bangladesh from Friday 8 March 2019 to Wednesday 13 March 2019, 6am to 10.30pm:
  - Slip Lane (Buckle Street to Kent Terrace).

# Background

- 4. The Council receives numerous requests throughout the year for public roads to be closed for public and private events. In order for the closures to have effect, under Schedule 10 of the Local Government Act 1974, Council approval is required.
- The authority to approve requests for road closures is made under Schedule 10, clause 11(e), of the Local Government Act 1974 and the Transport (Vehicular Traffic Road Closure) Regulations 1965. This authority is delegated to the Regulatory Processes Committee.
- 6. This report has been prepared in accordance with the procedures that were approved by the Committee on 15 December 2010. In summary, these are:
  - An event organiser applies for a road closure where a proposed event requires one.
  - Council officers receive the proposal and assess the merits and need for a road closure.
  - The Council advertises its intention to close the road in the public notice column of the local newspaper and on social media.
  - Together with the event organiser, Council officers ensure consultation with affected stakeholders is carried out and a communication plan is formulated.
  - Any objections are followed up and resolved as far as practical.
  - The event organiser works together with Council officers to modify any plans in response to public submissions and prepares an impact report for the Committee.
  - Council officers recommend any conditions that should apply to the approval.

- The Committee deliberates on the proposed road closure.
- A Council officer notifies the event organiser of the Committee's decision. If the proposed closure is approved, council officers ensure the event organisers follow the agreed communication plan including notifying the public and affected parties. The event is also monitored to ensure the traffic management plan is adhered to and any associated conditions are followed to keep the public safe and to avoid any unreasonable impact on traffic.

#### POLISH CHRISTMAS MARKET SATURDAY 17 NOVEMBER 2018

#### 1. Description of Event

The Polish Christmas market has been held in the Dom Polski (Polish House) 257 Riddiford Street, Newtown since 1956. Last year there was over whelming support for this market, so to cater for the growing number of participants an application has been made to hold it on street this year. If using Rhodes Street is a success the organisers will look at continuing on the street in the future.

It is expected the market will add to the vibe of destinations around Wellington City and it is supported by the Newtown Residents Association, who have a vast experience in organising events, being the Newtown Festival.

The proposed road closures are for: Saturday 17 November 2018 6am to Midnight, Rain Day Sunday 18 November 2018.

- Rhodes Street (between Riddiford Street and Fergusson Street)
- Arney Street (Riddiford Street to the End)

Road closure notification boards will be placed at each end of the closure at least one week prior to the event.

The event will be managed by a qualified temporary traffic management company. Pedestrians access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

#### 5. Traffic Impact Assessment

#### **Prior Closures**

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more Than 31 days in a year.

#### Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Stephen Harte Implementation Manager, Network Improvements, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to an approved traffic management plan, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

#### Conditions:

- The road closures will start at 6am and finish at Midnight.
- The event organiser is to obtain Council approval on the details of a traffic management plan prior to the event.
- The detour route is to be clearly signed during road closures.
- Only authorised vehicles will be allowed within the road closure area, travelling at no more than Walking speed (3km/h) to ensure public safety is not compromised.
- The event organiser will publicise the event via media releases, letter drops and advanced signage to notify the public of the road closures.
- The event organiser is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the temporary traffic management plan during the road closures.
- The event organiser is responsible for maintaining public safety within the road closure area.
- The event organiser is to consult with emergency services and ensure the traffic management plan includes all of their special requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the traffic management company adheres to the approved traffic management plan.
- The event organiser must have a Health and Safety plan, which covers how emergency vehicles are to enter the road closure site if required.

## **PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – IMPACT REPORT**

#### A VERY WELLY CHRISTMAS SATURDAY 24 NOVEMBER 12PM TO 8PM SUNDAY 25 NOVEMBER 12PM TO 6PM

#### 1. Description of Event

The Wellington Christmas Festival is to take place on the weekend of November 24/25 2018. This festival is seen as an effective way to celebrate Christmas in the capital.

Key Stakeholders – Santa Parade participants, local retailers, the Chamber of Commerce, the general public have been involved with the development of the festival concept which has generated considerable excitement and support.

Organisations involved in supporting the festival include Wreda, Museums Wellington, Capital E, Greater Wellington Regional Council. Performers likely to be at the festival are the NZSO, Orchestra Wellington and the Rodger Fox Band.

The Christmas festival will extend the length of Lambton Quay, which will run from 12pm to 8pm on Saturday 24 November and 12pm to 6pm on Sunday 25 November 2018.

Vehicular access to retail outlets for restocking within the road closure times will be managed by creating a Northbound access-way on Lambton Quay between 10pm Saturday and 8am Sunday.

The Bus service will be relocated to run Southbound on Featherston and Northbound on Customhouse Quay.

Elements featured in the festival will include the arrival of Santa and a procession to his grotto, a carols concert, creative and interactive activities for children and families, main stage entertainment, strolling costumed characters and acts, storytelling, face painting and costumed photo opportunities. For these two days of Christmas, the downtown area will become a place of community celebration, creativity and retail engagement.

- Johnson Street (Wilson Carpark to Lambton Quay)
- o Brandon Street (Half way on Brandon Street to Lambton Quay)

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Road closure notifications boards will be place at each end of the road closure 7 working days prior to the event. Resident and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the road closures and the parking restrictions. 



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
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# APPROVAL OF NAME FOR LANEWAY OFF THORNDON QUAY

# Purpose

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval of a name for a laneway at 30 Thorndon Quay, Pipitea, known as Capital Gateway, as shown on F Plan 3102 (**Attachment 1**).

# Summary

- 2. A laneway gives access to retail premises on the upper level at Capital Gateway, located at 30 Thorndon Quay, Pipitea.
- 3. The owners have asked Council to consider naming this laneway so that the retail outlets can be more easily found by shoppers and delivery people.

# Recommendations

That the Regulatory Processes Committee:

- 1. Receives the information.
- 2. Approves the name **Gateway Lane** for the laneway to the upper level retail premises at 30 Thorndon Quay, as shown on F Plan 3102.

# Background

- 4. The Council's post-Christchurch eathquake activities undertaken to prepare for the eventuality of a major earthquake in Wellington has included a project to ensure inner city and suburban centre properties display correct addresses. This will improve post-disaster recovery response times. It also ensures that members of the public and emergency services can readily identify and locate the site of emergencies in urban and surburban centres.
- 5. As part of the project, the property manager at Capital Gateway, 30 Thorndon Quay, was approached with regards to the address being used at this site.
- 6. The owners of Capital Gateway have subsequently asked Council to consider naming the laneway leading to the upper level retail premises to allow these to be more easily located by shoppers and delivery people.
- This request is in accord with the Council's Road Naming Procedures (August 2002), and the Addressing Standard (AS/NZS 4819:2011) administered by Land Information New Zealand.

# Discussion

- 8. Following contact by members of the Council's Land, Customer and Property Information Team with regards to the address being used at Capital Gateway on Thorndon Quay in Pipitea, the property manager, on behalf of the owners, have requested the laneway leading to the upper level retail premises be named.
- 9. The laneway leading to the upper level retail premises at 30 Thorndon Quay, known as Capital Gateway, is privately owned and maintained. Access to the lane is off Thorndon

Quay, but separate from the entrance to the parking for visitors to the lower level tenancies. Naming the upper level laneway will reduce confusion currently reported by the owners on behalf of visitors to the site.

- 10. The owners initially proposed the names Capital Lane, Thorndon Lane and Hermes Lane. The owners also advised that they would be happy to accept the name Pipi Lane, which was suggested by officers. This latter name acknowledges the history of the area as a source of kaimoana, reflected in the name of the suburb in which this retail precinct is located (that is, Pipitea).
- 11. Of the names proposed, officers feel the name Capital has potential as a name for a more significant road. There is also a possibility the retail precinct Capital Gateway could be renamed in the future. Thorndon is already in use, as Thorndon Quay. Checks with the Greater Wellington Regional Council revealed the names Hermes and Pipi have been already reserved for use by Porirua City Council.
- 12. The Council's Parks, Sport and Recreation team has no objection to the use of the name **Gateway Lane** in this area.
- 13. The Council's Tira Poutama, Iwi Partnerships team has advised they no objection to the proposed name. Tira Poutama have commented that if Capital Gateway as a whole was being renamed then consideration of a te reo name for the retail centre as a whole, as well as the lane to the upper level of the centre, would be appropriate in such a circumstance.
- 14. Greater Wellington Regional Council has confirmed the name **Gateway Lane** is available, but note that it is similar to the name **Kate Way** in Karori. However, officers feel that the proposed name is sufficiently dissimilar such that there won't be any confusion between the two. Additionally, the two names are located in different suburbs, further reducing the potential for confusion between the two.

#### **Recommended Names**

15. Council officers recommend the name Gateway Lane be approved for the laneway to the upper level retail and commercial premises at 30 Thorndon Quay, known as Capital Gateway, as shown on F Plan 3102. Officers feel this name is the most appropriate based on feedback from those consulted, and the relevant provisions of documents guiding road naming, such as the Council's Road Naming Procedures (2002) and Te Tauihu: Te Reo Māori Policy (2018).


