Chris Thomas representing the Falun Gong addressed the meeting to update the Committee on the Chinese Premier's visit to Wellington and discussed news that the organisation had received from China.

086/06P LIQUOR CONTROL BYLAW – ORAL HEARINGS

(1215/52/IM) (REPORT 1)

NOTED:

1. Michael Bott spoke on the behalf of the New Zealand Council for Civil Liberties about his concerns that an extended bylaw will push the homeless out of the inner city. He highlighted issued surrounding the

- consumption of methylated spirits in the inner city area and contested any claims that the current control bylaw had seen a decrease in the public consumption of alcohol.
- 2. Wayne Coffey addressed the Committee as resident of Oriental Bay and requested that the boundaries of the bylaw be extended to include Oriental Bay. He outlined concerns that the bylaw will move disorderly behaviour from the proposed area to Oriental Bay if the boundaries are not extended.
- 3. Graham Hare spoke in support of the proposed bylaw Option A. While in support of a 24 hour ban for easier understanding, he noted that there was a fine balance between people's rights and controls over drink. He was concerned that people would not be able to have alcohol at a picnic during the day in popular recreation areas such as Waitangi Park.
- 4. Victor Davie voiced concerns that the proposed bylaw does not prevent disorderly behaviour during daylight hours. He supports a 24 hours seven day a week liquor ban within a more restricted geographical area than the bylaw proposes.
- 5. Richard Te One representing Regional Public Health spoke in support of Option A. Regional Public Health also supports the Councils ability to impose a liquor ban for special events across the city as required. He noted the changes in drinking habits/patterns and the difficulties in adapting to these.
- 6. Michael Taylor spoke against the proposed bylaw as there was no evidence that the current liquor ban is working. He believes that the whole population should not be subject to restrictions due to the behaviour of few.

(Councillor Wain left the meeting at 10.31am.)

7. William Beauchamp notes that there is a problem with homeless drinking alcohol in public areas, but is concerned that the bylaw will move the problem to a non-controlled area. Suggested creating a licensed area selling cheap alcohol for those who can not afford established bars.

(The meeting adjourned for morning tea at 10.45am and reconvened at 10.58am.)

8. Paul Riley representing the Ministry of Culture and Heritage spoke about damage caused to the National War Memorial and the Tomb of the Unknown Warrior and asked that the bylaw be extended to include the National War Memorial 24 hours seven days a week.

(Councillor Morrison returned to the meeting at 11.05am.)

9. Inspector Paul Berry from the New Zealand Police spoke in support of the proposed bylaw. The Police believe that Option A will be sufficient given current levels of recorded offending. He reinforced that the bylaw does not intend to stop people drinking in licensed premises and that discretionary enforcement would continue.

(Councillor Wain returned to the meeting at 11.24am.) (Councillor Foster left the meeting at 11.27am.)

10. Kester Fordham representing Walkwise spoke in support of the proposed bylaw. Walkwise have noted an increase in disorderly behaviour on a Thursday night and support Option A. Mr Fordham said that he had seen a definite improvement in behaviour and litter since the Original bylaw came into force.
