195/06P PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

(1215/52/IM)

NOTED:

- 1. Mark McGuiness addressed the Committee on Report 2 "Proposed District Plan Change 49 and Variation 3 Port Noise Emission Levels and Building Insulation Rules". Mr McGuiness spoke about the impact the proposed changes would have on his company as the chosen developer of the Overseas Passenger Terminal and the increased costs they were likely to incur as a result. He highlighted the inaccuracy and disparities that could occur when using acoustic analysis in such decisions.
- 2. Neville Hyde representing CentrePort drew the Committee's attention to the role of the Port and its specific activities in relation to Report 2.. He noted the "location specific" nature of a port and requested that be considered in context alongside the needs of residential and commercial occupants who come into that area. Mr Hyde requested greater dialogue between Wellington Waterfront Ltd and CentrePort when deciding what activities were appropriate in the Lambton Harbour basin.
- 3. Bernie Harris spoke to Reports 1, 4 and 5. In relation to Report 1 "Wellington Regional Strategy", Mr Harris urged caution in respect of the economic outcomes of such a plan. In respect of Reports 4 and 5, Mr Harris drew the Committee's attention to his experience in these areas and requested that Councillors ensure they were kept informed by Officers in this area. Mr Harris also spoke about the Development Contributions Policy in relation to the Report 3 "Proposed District Plan Change 50: Aro Valley Boundary adjustments and Pre-1930s Demolition rule".
- 4. Roland Sapsford spoke on behalf of the Aro Valley Community Council in support of the changes being proposed under District Plan Change 50. He noted that Aro Valley was the only suburb directly adjacent to the Central Business District (CBD) without such a demolition rule currently in place. Mr Sapsford commended the large scale consultation undertaken by officers in the Aro Valley about the

plan change, and noted the wide-spread support within the community for such a plan change.

196/06P **DEPUTATION**

NOTED:

Chris Dillon representing Wellington International Airport Ltd (WIAL) addressed the Committee on Report 3. He noted the disparities that appeared between the Air Noise Boundary rules and proposed Port Noise rules. Mr Dillon's concerns focussed largely around residential development in both areas and the restrictions that applied. He was concerned that the proposed plan change would see a preference for noise tolerance for goods that are carried by sea, rather than by air, and ultimately further restrictions being placed on the airport.

Note that based on the model proposed in the Wellington Regional Strategy this requires the formation of an interim committee to hear submissions on the Strategy and make recommendations to Greater Wellington, and that this committee would include representatives of all councils in the region plus five eminent non-local government members.
- 6. Note that there will be an opportunity for councils to comment on the draft Statement of Proposal, and to make formal submissions as part of this process.
- 7. Agree to recommend to Council that it:
 - (a) Agree in principle to the proposal under Section 16 of the Local Government Act 2002 for Greater Wellington Regional Council to undertake a new activity, i.e. governance of the Wellington Regional Strategy and the economic development activity described in the Strategy.
 - (b) Agree to the Council signing the Memorandum of Understanding attached as Appendix 1 (to the Officer's report) that sets out how consultation on the Wellington Regional Strategy and its proposed governance, implementation and funding will be achieved, the initiation of a section 16 LGA2002 process and the establishment of a committee of Greater Wellington to manage the consultation and to hear submissions, on the basis that a further agreement will be entered into between the councils at the conclusion of the consultation process that records the position going forward.
 - (c) Agree to nominate the Mayor as the representative for the Greater Wellington Interim WRS Committee.
- 8. Agree that officers endeavour to ensure that appropriate review provisions for a review to take place no later than 3 years after commencement are included in the multilateral agreement.

- 4. Agree to take into account the peak oil issue and rising fuel prices when making future transport investment decisions, by promoting and designing a transport system that encourages more efficient use of and reduced reliance on oil-based products.
- 5. Agree to engage, where possible and appropriate, with Government on this issue through (for example) the development of the government's New Zealand Energy Strategy, National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy, and Biofuels legislation.
