Mr Duston expressed the concerns of the Mt Victoria Residents Association on the impact that these Traffic Resolutions may have upon residents in the area. He stressed that this should be a safety initiative to prevent further injuries in the Hataitai Bus Tunnel. Mr Duston also refuted some comments made in the Officers' Report regarding communication and agreements between the Residents Association, and NZ Bus.


