# 10<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE, 22 – 23 FEBRUARY 2011

# 1. Purpose of Report

This report provides information on the New Zealand 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Emergency Management Conference 2011 to be held in Wellington on 22 and 23 February 2011, and to seek approval for one elected member to attend the conference.

## 2. Recommendations

Officers recommend that the Committee:

- 1. Receive the information.
- 2. Approve the attendance of one elected member at the 10th Annual Emergency Management Conference 2011 to be held in Wellington on 22 and 23 February 2011 and that the costs associated with attending the conference be met from the Elected Members' budget (GVEM01).
- 3. Agree that should the nominated elected member(s) be unable to attend, they may ask another elected member to attend in their place.
- 5. Note that a report back on the conference will be presented to the Strategy and Policy Committee in accordance with Council policy.
- 6. Note that there are no meetings scheduled for the 22 or the 23 February 2011.

## 3. Discussion

The 2011 conference is the 10th annual integrated emergency management conference and is supported by the Ministry of Civil Defence and Emergency Management (MCDEM).

The 10th Annual Emergency Management Conference will focus on the Canterbury earthquake and look at many aspects of the disaster including:

- The response from both a national and local perspective
- Communicating in a disaster
- Developing successful emergency management teams
- Multi-agency coordination and out of town staff integration
- Early lessons identified from MCDEM
