2011/2012 DRAFT WATERFRONT DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR CONSULTATION

1. Purpose of Report

3. Discussion

The 2011/2012 Waterfront Development Plan provides an update on the 2010/2011 work programme and the proposed work programme for the coming year - 2011/2012.

In previous years the Draft Waterfront Development Plan has been consulted on as a separate consultation process. At the Council meeting of 23 February 2011, Council agreed that the 2011/2012 Waterfront Development Plan be included in the 2011/2012 Draft Annual Plan for consultation. There will be no separate consultation process for the 2011/2012 Waterfront Development Plan and submissions on this plan will be made as part of the Draft Annual Plan process.
