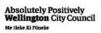

Purpose

1. Those organisations supported in principle by the Joint Committee will be asked to submit a detailed application and budget before funding is offered.

Summary

- 2. The Fund is now in its fourth year of operation. It has enabled and supported many projects and organisations across Wellington's arts and environmental sectors that would otherwise not have happened. It is now a well-established fund relied on by organisations to deliver activities that have an impact on and a broad reach across the region, because of this demand is increasing.
- 3. The Fund Manager therefore recommends that the Joint Committee consider the original purpose of the fund when reviewing the Fund Manager and Council Officer's recommendations that is to support entities of regional significance and new projects that add to the attractiveness and vitality of the region. It is important that the fund is used to best effect so it does not lose its positive impact on the region.
- 4. The Wellington Regional Amenities Fund received 23 Expressions of Interest for the 2015/16 round. 13 of these Expressions of Interest were for multi-year (either two or three years) funding. A summary of all the Expressions of Interest received is attached

- at Appendix one. This round marks the first year the fund can be applied for over three years, however a portion of the fund will be retained each year for annual Expressions of Interest.
- 5. The Council Officers Group and Fund Manager recommend the Joint Committee supports the following 16 projects and organisations over the next three financial years from 2015/16 to 2017/18.

Background

- 6. The Wellington Regional Amenities Fund provides support for arts, cultural and environmental attractions and events. The Joint Committee have set five priorities for funding which are:
 - a. Demonstrate a need for financial assistance to maintain its current operations or extend the reach of its operations across the Wellington region.
 - b. Increase the entity's long-term contribution to the economy of the Wellington region.
 - c. Address gaps in, extend or develop the arts, culture or environmental ecosystems, calendar of activities and events in the Wellington Region.
 - d. Display regional partnerships with Councils and other organisations in order to leverage mutual benefits.

Build, maintain and retain organisations that contribute to Wellington's status as e. an internationally competitive region.

Discussion

- 7. The Wellington Regional Amenities Fund received 23 Expressions of Interest in the 2015/16 round requesting a total of \$2,578,950.oo. In the second year (2016/17) 13 organisations requested \$1,502,862, and in the third year (2017/18) ten organisations requested \$1,212,800.
- 8. The fund has up to \$1,053,200.oo to allocate each year for the next three years from 2015/16 to 2017/18. The Joint Committee agreed to allow multi-year funding Expressions of Interest while retaining a portion for annual Expressions of Interest.
- As per the Terms of Reference for the Fund the cross-Council Officers Group has 9. assessed the applications and made recommendations to the Joint Committee.
- 10. Officer's recommendations are based on alignment with the Funds priorities, ability to meet the criteria and the likely effectiveness of funding the project. Officers have taken into account the management of previous funding through accountability reports.
