2 Oral Reports

2.1 Submission to the Draft Long Term Plan

It was agreed that Christine Grace would draft the Board's Long Term Plan submission. Following discussion it was decided that the submission should contain a specific request for year-by-year funding for road safety issues similar to the \$100,000 that had been granted for the current financial year. In relation to this Christine Grace agreed to ascertain from Team Leader Resurfacing/Contracts, Steve Wright as to progress made with improvements to the corner at 365 Ohariu Valley Road which the aforementioned \$100,000 was to be spent on.

2.2 Draft Makara/Ohariu Community Plan

Christine Grace stated that she would forward the latest survey-related information received from Senior Advisor Planning and Reporting, Marissa Cairncross to members and consult with her as to future steps to be taken.



2.3 Possible Introduction of Security Cameras in Makara and/or Ohariu

Christine Grace reported that there had been several burglaries in the Makara area of late and the question had been raised as to whether security cameras should be installed. It was suggested that this could be included as part of the questionnaire. Given that the extent of the criminal occurrences was at this stage unknown it was decided that a general reminder via the Makara and Ohariu Email loops vis-à-vis simple home security measures would be sufficient.

2.4 Report back on Flood Protection meeting at Greater Wellington Regional Council

Wayne Rudd reported that flood protection measures were in the hands of individual landowners who could, subject to the necessary consents, make any changes that they saw fit. He noted that a specific fund was available in cases in which two or more properties were affected. This would contribute up to 30 per cent of the total cost of remedial work. He added that the Greater Wellington Regional Council although sceptical as to the effectiveness of such work, would nevertheless not stand in the way of landowners wanting to pursue action. However they themselves would not engage in any further consultancy at this stage.

A question was posed as to whether consent conditions could be changed so as to allow Meridian to stop its planting programme.

It was agreed that a request would be lodged for a copy of the relevant report by Opus to see whether there was any mention made re controlling flooding.

2.5 Goat Control Results

Christine Grace outlined the stakeholder meeting that had been held on 18 March. The Wellington Natural Heritage Trust indicated that they would submit an Expression of Interest to the Department of Conservation for further funding to enable the project's continuation. Other funding avenues would also be explored.
