UPDATE ON RECREATION FACILITIES FOR THE THIRD QUARTER (INCLUDING APRIL) 2005/06

1. Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update the board on recreation facilities and activities for the third quarter of the 2005/2006 financial year including April). Recreation facilities include the Tawa Swimming Pool, Tawa Recreation Centre, Linden Social Centre and Tawa Community Facility.

2. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board:

3. Tawa Community Pool

A revised staff roster system for all WCC pools operations personnel was introduced on 1 February 2006. Benefits of this change include greater equity in the spread of hours worked and less reliance on casuals and part-time staff at weekends. A further advantage has been the inclusion of a dedicated staff training shift each week.

A new Operations Team Leader was appointed 24 January. Jo Saxton comes to Tawa Pool after several years as a Lifeguard and Duty Manager at the Wellington Regional Aquatic Centre.

Several swim events were held at the pool during the beginning of 2006. The Wellington Swimming Association Relay Champs held in February attracted 325 entries and the Tawa Swimming Club annual club championships held 13 and 16 March were also very well attended. Tawa and Papakowhai Schools held their swimming sports in March.

Events coming up in the next quarter include the Gold Coast Swimming Zone Swim Carnival on 9 April and the Tawa Swimming Club's Splash & Dash Swim Meet on 21 May.

The Pool received written notice that the Tornadoes Swimming Club would wind up its activities effective from 31 March 2006.

Tawa Pool's 5-yearly Maintenance Closure is scheduled for July 2006. Significant works will include the first phase of roof replacement and building insulation. The swimming club and changing room roof areas will be replaced and an upgrade of changing room and associated services will also be completed. Routine filtration, circulation and HVAC plant renewals and system checks will be undertaken.

Attendance

Third quarter (including April) attendances totalled 46,047. This is down 3,978 on 2004/05 attendance of 50,025 for the same period. This drop in participation is consistent with other pools and attributed to poor weather in March which reportedly, was the coldest and wettest for thirteen years.

Total facility attendance year to date is up 532 on total year to date attendance of 118,104 for the same period in the previous year.

Overall the pool is on target to achieve its attendance target for 2005/06 of 142,150

Term one aquatic programmes were operating at or near capacity. There were 819 enrolments in the public learn to swim programme with class occupancy maintained at over 85%.

The schools aquatic education programme had 3,205 participants in the third quarter and the overall participation by schools is up 2,988 year to date.

The January Learn-To-Swim Holiday Programme had a record number of 196 enrolments.

The Schools, Public and Holiday Programmes for Learn to Swim at Tawa Pool continue to be the most popular and successful of all the cities four community pools.

The Tawa Recreation Centre already has bookings for the coming months for Birthday parties, Handball, Netball Wellington, Contenders Boxing Club, April School Holiday Programme, Soccer, and WCC delivered Netball League. The facility is heavily booked Mondays to Thursdays each week. Weekend opportunities are currently available and the college utilises both gyms on Fridays during and out of school time.

Total participation for the third quarter (including April) was 4,573 and the total attendance year to date for 2005/06 is 17,298.

Attendance for the same period in 2004/05 was 3,854. Attendance is up 719 compared to the third quarter (including April) last year. The centre opened November 2004.

5. Linden Social Centre

The total number of hours used at the centre during the quarter including April was 341 up 40 hours compared to the same time last year. Occupancy of the centre was up 2.5% and a positive period for hall usage with the number of users up 1,068 on total participation of 5,270. The total number of users for the centre year to date is 15,473 up 2,778 for the same period in 2004/05.

Tawa Community Theatre has commenced rehearsal and performances for their first production of the 206 year.

Re-painting of the centre roof commenced in March but has been delayed due to adverse weather conditions during the month.

6. Tawa Community Facility

Use of the former ANZ Bank building commenced on Tuesday 8 February 2006. Regular activities include older adult exercise classes "Ezy Movers" Dance Classes 3 days per week and a small orchestra practice on Sundays. The facility is also becoming increasingly popular for 'one off 'programme and event hires. Bookings and requests for use are facilitated through the Tawa Recreation Centre.

A sprung wooden floor area was installed in April to provide opportunity for safely expanding physical activity programmes including pre-school activities, aerobic exercise, dance and movement.

WCC Building Consents and Licensing Services (BCLS) are currently vacating the area previously operated as the Tawa Service Centre. Following this the City Communities Business Unit with input from Recreation Wellington and Tawa Community Board representatives will identify interested groups and opportunities for future community use.

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
