#### 2. Welcome from the Chair

#### 4. Memorial Park

#### Discussion:

- Subgroup meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> October.
- Wanted to catch up briefly after that to check if there were any further questions.
- AAG to get in touch with the Ministry of Culture and Heritage. Purpose is
  to ensure that the policy around events include provision of temporary
  accessible toilets in an appropriate ratio to the able bodied units provided.
- There will be toilets eventually in the Education Centre but this won't be delivered in 2015 (with the completion of Memorial Park).
- Final detail design for the project is to be presented either to subcommittee or November meeting after Barrier Free audit.

## 5. Lower Cuba st

#### Presentation:

- Feedback based on AAG's earlier report in 2012.
- There are rules around sandwich board locations and those with license should know that.
- Accessible car park needs to be reviewed, and placed more appropriately.
- New planned upgrade of lower Cuba street is trying to achieve two things
  - a. Improve the tree pit issues
  - b. Improve the shared space
- Currently the upgrade work has no funding allocated to it.

#### Discussion:

- Density of planting needs to be increased or upstands installed
- Tactile indicators used at the Wakefield end of lower Cuba street are not contrasting. Royal NZ Foundation for the Blind recommends yellow studs as they stand out. The current silver studs don't work well as a contrast. Maybe colour the concrete back if using silver studs in the future.
- Tactile indicator studs are also still popping out.
- Auckland Council has done shared spaces well. It was recommended that Jamie draws on their examples for any redesign.
- Concern about using british standards when NZ has great best practice examples
- Height of the multifaceted blocks should be 75 mm not 45mm which is the lowest standard kerb. Also they do not provide enough contrast for the vision impaired (grey on grey)
- Seating needs to be accessible with back rest and arms.
- The existing orange/white signage needs to be accessible (contrasting). Action:
- Lisa to forward information regarding shared spaces from Jason to Jamie
- Alan to forward Ted Talk link to share with Jamie.

## 6. Neighbours Day

#### Presentation:

- Third year of Neighbours Day
- The theme this year is celebrating Wellington's diversity focussing on ethnic, migrant and vulnerable communities and increasing community resilience and emergency preparedness.
- Set groups and suburbs will be targeted.
- There will be a range of activities in various places. Wallet sized cards are being developed to keep contacts for neighbours. 50,000 are being printed.
- Elizabeth will approach disability groups to find out whether they want to be involved. She will also:
  - a. Check the venues for accessibility and that will be part of promotion.
  - b. Make sure the promotional material is accessible.

#### Discussion:

- Men's Shed part of their philosophy is being a good neighbour.
- Involve as many disability groups as possible e.g. sporting groups (use Parafed as a contact.
- Elizabeth was advised that information should be delivered in a variety of different media, and in accessible formats.
