Mark outlined the role of the ERG to Kena and Mike, attending their first meeting. Highlighted points include:

- The Terms of Reference for the Group (the link to the page where these can be found is here: http://wellington.govt.nz/your-council/meetings/committees/environmental-reference-group)
- The role of the ERG as an advisory group
- The group's active agenda to be proactive at early stages of policy development
- The group's role in submitting on pertinent issues

Crispian noted the strategic nature of advisory group interactions with Council and the role played by Democratic Services in liaising between the ERG and Council officers.

Carline requested that members compile biographical statement where don't have one currently:

- Portfolio work/feedback
- General ERG documents catch-up
- Mark introduced the portfolio structure to Mike and Kena.
 - Lynn will buddy up with Mike on the biodiversity portfolio;
 and
 - Kena will buddy up with Shenagh and Graeme on the urban growth/urban design portfolio.
- Kena and Mike both expressed interest in the Mana Whenua Iwi and Treaty Relations portfolio, however, there is currently no Council officer assigned to this role.
- Mark noted that much of the group's work occurs outside of the monthly meetings.
- Carline to revise the biodiversity portfolio information.
- General discussion regarding the role of ERG and interactions with Council:

- Shenagh and Lynn expressed a preference for powerpoint presentations to the ERG by Council officers be circulated to the group several days in advance. This would enable the group to be prepared to give more meaningful feedback.
- o Interactions are more or less effective depending on the Council officer.
- Council not perceived to be following its policies and strategies.
- General agreement that ERG should take an overview approach to its work rather than a piecemeal approach, so that instead of looking at items on a case-by-case basis, common themes can be identified and a set of key principles developed that can be consistently applied in multiple areas.
 - These principles could be reiterated whenever a submission is presented.
 - Mark highlighted the importance of timeliness; early input to policies, programmes and strategies better for influencing these before the 'call for submissions' stage
- Programme planning document: Hamish noted that this is a living document
 - o Carline to circulate document to the group via dropbox
- Cr Gilberd: encouraged ERG to make submissions and write letters either support or oppose a proposed Council direction (letters can be written instead of a formal submission). These are useful to help Council make decisions on policy, strategies, programmes and direction. Noted that:
 - central government has input into Wellington Region activities
 - things often happen very quickly, therefore ERG should make its views, based on its expertise, known to Councillors via letters and submissions so that this information can be taken into account
 - conversations need to be conducted with positivity, sensitivity, affability, and good intent
 - economics (resources) direct Council actions to some extent (will have discussion with David Chick on this subject)
