# Library feedback:

Kini Piper from Wellington Libraries came to get feedback on the issues for teenagers that libraries can provide information on in their proposed workgroups. They also need information on how and where to start looking for the information.

- Great that people were still interested by the afternoon
- Good variety of activities in the second half of the day
- Youtube videos were effective as they kept the group motivated

Youth Council members discussed the possibility of having more events for young people to come and discuss youth issues together. A suggestion was made to hold youth forums more regularly so young people can interact. Questions were:

- 1. How to get diverse young people to discuss common issues?
- 2. What is done with the information?
