### 1. Opening

# 5. Previous minutes and matters arising

# 7. Presentation from Her Worship the Mayor, Celia Wade-Brown

The Mayor talked with the YC about proposals to change the way local government is organised in the Wellington region. She discussed:

- Why is WCC looking at change?
- What WCC resolved to do
- What has been done to date and where to now?
- 2012 survey results on change/no change balanced
- 2012 Survey results on boundary change
- Option 1: Single unitary Council with one tier of governance
- Option 2: Single unitary Council with two tiers of governance using local boards
- Option 3: Status quo (or modified status quo e.g. a unified Wairarapa)

## 8. Presentation from Amber Bill on the Our Living City programme

Amber Bill talked to the YC about the WCC's new Our Living City programme. Her presentation covered:

- What makes Wellington special among the world's leading cities?
- How Our Living City fits with the WCC brand and the 2040 strategy
- Work programme goals and activities including 2 case studies
- Pilot projects and 'showcases'
- Good research
- Communications and engagement
- Our Living City Process

#### 9. General Business

### Media coverage: Breakfast TV, Northern Courier

Jack and Erin represented YC on TV One's Breakfast on 9 April. The interview went well but was so short (1'30") that it wasn't posted to the Breakfast website. The producer said he would post us the interview on a DVD.

Jack, Erin and Petelo were interviewed by the community newspaper, the Northern Courier, on 11 April. The journalist wanted to feature YC members from the northern suburbs.

### Multicultural Council meeting (Jack, Sean)

Jack and Sean attended the 9 April meeting of the Multicultural Council (MC). The MC expressed a desire to work with the YC. The MC has a youth officer. This could be a similar relationship as with the Boys' and Girls' Institute.

## BeCause workshop (Bing, Sean)

Bing and Sean attended the BeCause workshop on 15 April. BeCause will be an online platform that allows anyone to nominate a young Kiwi leading change in their community. The top-voted nominee and four judge favourites will be paired up with some of NZ's hottest filmmakers to make a film about their story. Bing and Sean helped with marketing and voting strategies, e.g. guerrilla marketing and social media. They noted that YC could use similar strategies.

#### **Youth Week**

## **Tertiary Student Fares**
