# Victoria St redevelopment

Richard Galloway gave some background on the redevelopment and the Memorial Park Alliance. The redevelopment is planned to be complete at the end of June 2015 and has a budget of \$11M. Victoria Street will be a major site of growth in the central city over the next decade. The aim is to make it a premier street that supports a vibrant inner city suburb, improves transport efficiency and experiences for road users and pedestrians.

Issues that were discussed included:

- How disruption will be managed
- The long term capacity of the road give projected population growth, new transport technologies and changing generational attitudes to public transport
- How more apartments lead to more cafes and eventually to other retail and commercial businesses
- The area need to be safe to attract young people
- Changeable, colourful artistic displays may attract people too
- Victoria Street to complement Cuba Street
- Cycle lanes and safety
- Overcoming the barrier that is State Highway 1 at peak times
- Mid-block pedestrian access above or under the road

Members were also asked to send Bing photographs of their favourite places for the competition's Facebook campaign. The next working group meeting is after YC and will focus on whether to make a video.

# Skills workshop with regions' YCs including input on GWRC Regional Land Transport Plan

Six youth councillors attended a skills workshop on 13 September in Titahi Bay that included members from Porirua's Youth Advisory Group, Hutt City's Youth Infusion and the Kapiti District Council's Youth Council. Material was elicited for the GWRC Regional Land Transport Plan. Ollie, Anya, Jack and Eva volunteered to be on a working group to prepare a submission based on this and their own ideas. Morgan was added to the group in absentia as he has shown prior interest.

#### Induction: YC Manual

Members reviewed the draft Youth Council Manual in small groups and then had a plenary discussion. Members thought it contained the right content, was easy to read but should include an example of a submission. The electronic version of the document should contain links to WCC and GWRC alerts.
