1. Opening

7. General Business

Library services for young people

Adrienne Hannan and Karl Gaskin introduced a project on the future of libraries and how the library experience for young people may change. Libraries are now community hubs, not just collections of books. It is important to get input from young people across the city. The project will inform planning for 3, 5 and 10 year horizons and is considering questions such as:

- how can the network of libraries best benefit young people?
- should the Central Library have different services to those in the suburbs?
- how we can support and develop our librarians to better understand and meet the needs of young people

Member broke into 5 small groups to workshop pre-prepared questions and then discussed findings in a plenary session.

Members are to email Adrienne if they have further ideas, especially on ways to get the general public involved in the development of services.
