
Quarterly Review - Basin Reserve Trust


The Basin Reserve Trust has presented its report for the quarter ended 31 March 2012 for review. A summary of key findings is presented below and the full report is attached.

Highlights

- In March, the Basin Reserve hosted the NZ v South Africa test match. Despite the first two days being weather affected, over 11,000 people attended the test.
- > The final of the Gillette Cup schoolboy competition was held in March, as well as the annual Governor General's XI match.
- In February, the Council took the step of closing the seating in the Museum Stand to the public pending the results of a detailed condition assessment of the stand. The Trust is working with officers to determine the future of the stand.

Activities during the quarter

- On the final day of the season, the Basin Reserve hosted 12 primary school (year 3) team playing modified games on the outfield. The festival was very successful with a large crowd enjoying the spectacle.
- The Museum Stand was served a 'yellow sticker' as earthquake prone. Further, Council officers made a decision to close the stand to crowd loading, including for the NZ v South Africa test match.
- The Trust received formal visits from representatives of the Australian Football League and the CEO of the Cricket World Cup 2015 to assess the ground and off-field facilities for future use.

Financial Commentary

- > The Trust made an operating surplus for the quarter of \$74k after allowing for depreciation of \$68k, \$22k (42%) ahead of budget. YTD the Trust reports an operating surplus of \$38k, \$74 ahead of budget.
- Income was 18% above budget due to unbudgeted grant revenue and 'Gold' membership subscriptions.
- Expenditure was 17% over budget as a result of increased charges by the Stadium for turf maintenance, higher than anticipated administration costs and unbudgeted event expenses incurred during the test match as a result of bringing in additional toilet facilities for spectators.
