- 1. Receives the information.
- 2. Notes that the Proposal is outlined in detail within the business case in Attachment 1 to this report.
- 3. Note that the project scope has changed and the proposal is for a new purpose built convention centre on the Council owned site on Cable Street combined with an exhibition hall and a range of public spaces. Previous projects for the convention centre were consulted on in combination with the proposed Hilton Hotel and the proposed Movie Museum.
- 4. Notes that extensive consultation regarding the need to invest in convention facilities has been undertaken over the course of many years as set out in the report.
- 5. Note that a range of limited engagement on the proposal has been undertaken across the business community as set out in the report.
- 6. Notes the results of all of the consultation processes have consistently been positive and particularly from the commercial sector.
- 7. Notes that the proposal falls within the financial parameters included in the 2018-28 Long Term Plan for both capital expenditure and operating expenditure.
- 8. Note that the impact on ratepayers from the proposal is less than the financial provision included within the 2018-28 Long Term Plan.
- 9. Agrees to proceed with the proposal as set out in the report utilising the \$165.5m capital expenditure budget provided within the 2018-28 Long Term Plan.
- 10. Notes that funding from the Crown of \$25m is included in the project budgets and discussions with the Crown are on-going and until confirmed by the Crown this funding remains at risk.
- 11. Notes that Officers will report back within twelve months with recommendations to confirm the appointment of operators for the Convention and Exhibition operations.

- 12. Notes that the project can be funded within the existing Council Financial Strategy.
- 13. Agrees in principle to attaining a 5 NZ Greenstar building design and officers will report back in February 2019 on costs.

The withholding of the information is necessary to enable the local authority to carry on, without prejudice or disadvantage, negotiations (including commercial and industrial negotiations).

The making available of the information would be likely to endanger the safety of a person.

7(2)(d) The withholding of the information is necessary to avoid prejudice to measures protecting the health and safety of members of the public.
