Attachment 1

Observations written by David Ledson, independent chairperson of the Kāpiti Coast District Council Mayoral Waste Minimisation Forum (May–November 2019).

Background

- 1. The Wellington Region Waste Management and Minimisation Plan(2017-2023)(RWMMP23) has a relatively well known primary target, which is 'by 2026 to reduce the total quantity of waste sent to Class 1 landfills from 600kg/person/year to 400kg/person'.
- 2. Perhaps less well known is that there are a number of 'secondary and tertiary' targets; also set down for achievement by 2026, which are intended to support achieving the primary target, and they are:
 - a. A decrease in kerbside household waste to landfill from approximately 200 kilograms per person per annum to 143 kilograms per person per annum by 2026. Progress towards this target will be delivered by achieving the following:
 - Recycling an extra 13.5 kilograms per person per annum of household waste by 2026
 - Diversion of 34.5 kilograms per person of food waste from landfill per annum by 2026
 - A reduction of household waste generated of 9 kilograms per person per annum
 - b. A decrease in the total quantity of general waste (excluding kerbside and biosolids) from approximately 335 kilograms per person to 250 kilograms per person per annum by 2026.
 - c. A reduction in the quantity of sewage sludge (biosolids) sent to landfill from approximately 64 kilograms per person per annum to 4 kilograms per person per annum by 2026.
- 3. These targets are incorporated into the District WMMP's for 2017-23; including the Kapiti plan(KWMMP).

Discussion

4. If an organisation is to set a target and to be serious about pursuing the achievement of it, then it is vital that intermediate targets and the timelines for assessing whether these have been achieved are set, that an individual(or specific position) is made accountable for achieving the targets, that a process is in place to measure progress to the target, that the relevant decision-makers monitor progress at regular intervals and take steps to change approaches(including adjusting targets and allocating more resources) to ensure the organisation is set up for success.

- 5. Many of these factors do not appear to be incorporated into either the RWMMP23 or the KWMMP; it is not clear whether, for example:
 - a. intermediate targets have been established so that progress towards to 2026 targets can be measured at relevant intervals; or
 - b. if they have been set, the process and/or accountability for taking the measure and taking action locally and regionally to share information so that coordinated local and regional actions in response to the measurements can be taken.

Recommendations

- 6. It is recommended that:
 - a. Regional and District WMMPs and supporting processes be reviewed to determine whether improvements are required to ensure the 2026 targets will be achieved; or if not, why that may be the case.
 - b. The measurement of targets, and identification of any changes to current courses of actions/strategies be a central element of the regional waste assessment work for the next WMMP.
