
PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – IMPACT REPORT

KIRKCALDIES CHARITY STREET PARTY SATURDAY 24 NOVEMBER 2012

1. Description of Event

This is the seventh Kirkcaldie & Stains charity street party event and it is proposed to be held on Saturday 24 November 2012. It was a popular and busy event again last year, with money raised going towards Arthritis New Zealand. This year the charity benefiting will be Wellington Children's Hospital.

Whilst the event starts at 11.00am, it is necessary to have the road closed from 5.00am until 6:00pm to enable the erection of a marquee and other set-up and take-down tasks. The proposed closure is of **Brandon Street**, between Lambton Quay and Featherston Street, with no parking within the area and managed access to the two building parking entrances within the closure.

Affected businesses and residents in Brandon Street have received notification of the proposed event by Council approved letter drop. A further information notice will be given two weeks before the actual closure as a reminder. Road closure information sign boards will be in place at least 10 days prior to the closure. The event and road closures will be advertised in the Public Notices section of the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post the Tuesday before the event.

The event will be managed by a qualified temporary traffic management company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. Events Directorate Support

The Events Directorate has no connection with, and no objection to, this event.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of the Councils' Transport Network Manager, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to ensure that the event is publicised via media releases and notification signs to inform the public of the road closures.
- The event organiser is to consult and gain approval from the emergency services on the road closure and provide access for emergency vehicles.
- All vehicular accesses to the car parking entrances are to be marshal controlled to ensure public safety is not compromised.

NGĀ MANA WHENUA O TĀMAKI MAKĀURAU COLLECTIVE TREATY SETTLEMENT

Ratification of Deed of Settlement and Post-Settlement Governance Entities The mandated negotiators for the 13 iwi/hapu of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau have negotiated a collective redress offer from the Crown for the shared iwi/hapu interests in Tāmaki Makaurau. The offer is contained in the Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Deed of Settlement. The people of the iwi and hapū can now vote on whether to accept the proposed settlement and the post-settlement governance entities (PSGEs) that will administer the cultural and commercial settlement redress.

The two resolutions to be voted on are:

- 1. I support the Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Deed of Settlement.
2. I agree that the Tūpuna Taonga o Tāmaki Makaurau [Cultural Redress] Trust and the Whenua Haumi Roroa o Tāmaki Makaurau [Right of First Refusal] Limited Partnership will be the post-settlement governance entities for the Tāmaki Makaurau collective settlement.

You will be asked to vote for each of the following iwi/hapu with which you are registered:

With the recent initialling of the Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Deed of Settlement, the people of Ngāti Maru can vote on whether to accept the settlement redress and collective post-settlement governance entities to administer that redress. In order to receive the relevant parts of this redress, and the other settlement redress to come, the people can vote on whether to accept the Ngāti Maru Rūnanga Trust as the PSGE for Ngāti Maru.
