## **CHAIR'S REPORT COVERING MARCH 2013**

### **MATTERS ON THE GO**

#### **NEIGHBOURS' WEEKEND IN TAWA**

March was when it all happened, around 45 neighbourhood gatherings taking place on one of three weekends. See my separate report on this.

#### **REGIONAL GOVERNANCE REVIEW**

We have arranged a community meeting to be held at the Tawa Community Centre later this coming Sunday afternoon to give people the opportunity "... to learn more about the proposed changes. What are your views about Tawa becoming part of the new Porirua ward? Will there be a place for the Tawa Community Board in the future? Does there need to be? Come and have your say."

Brian Hannah (WCC) who gave a report on the Regional Governance Review at our March board meeting will give a presentation for 20 minutes. This will be preceded by Bruce Murray taking five minutes to provide a background on the history of Tawa and local government over the years. 30 minutes or so will be allowed for questions and discussion.

#### **BOARD NEWSLETTER**

We have formally agreed to publish and distribute a minimum of two community board newsletters each year for distribution to all 4600 households in Tawa. Work is well under way on a newsletter scheduled for distribution in mid-April.

#### **COMMUNITY ENEWSLETTER**

Tawa Community Board issues covered in the March eNewsletter were Neighbours' Weekend in Tawa, Local Government Reform proposals, and the hanging baskets, both the reduction in watering and how the baskets were initially funded.

#### **TAWA PRIMARY SCHOOLS' CITIZENSHIP AWARDS**

In the past couple of weeks I have visited the six primary schools and the Intermediate in Tawa, meeting two of the three new principals, handing over community board information and teeing up with each school a date to speak to their senior students about this year's Tawa Primary Schools' Citizenship Awards and how they might strive to be the winning student at their school.

# APPENDIX 1

## **THE HANGING BASKETS**

One week we were advising the community that the irrigation system watering the plants in the hanging baskets had been reduced to 30% of the previous level (because of water supply restrictions), the next week it had been turned off completely – as per Council instructions.

We subsequently put a request to the community (using our email network) for volunteers to take turns manually watering the plants one evening each week for four to five weeks from Easter onwards. More than 35 people responded. 24 have been rostered (four each evening) to use “unofficial” water to keep the plants alive, in addition to the Wednesday Guides taking charge of Wednesday evenings.

It has been a great community response and indicative of the fact that people are appreciative of the hanging baskets being an asset not only to our Main Road shopping centre but to the community as a whole.

## **COMMUNITY BOARD BEST PRACTICE AWARDS**
