Linden Rejuvenation Update

14 March 2019

- The Social Centre has been **staffed by Community Services** for 18 hours per week for the last 6 months;
- We have offered a further **6-month fixed term role** to a preferred candidate to carry on activation of the centre and the strategic framework for Linden (awaiting contract to present);
- A **survey** is currently being conducted with Linden residents to establish priorities, safety concerns and feedback – currently 90 respondents (closing Saturday). Our research team will evaluate the data to inform the framework and next steps.
- A **Champions' Group** is currently being established with community members and/or organisations. This is seen as a very "fluid" group with ToR to be established once the survey data is evaluated.
- A **Local Safety Plan** for Linden is being established. Going forward this includes:
 - Engaging with the businesses to hear their safety perspectives
 - Speaking to the police, who are very keen to be more involved about possibly running "safety" workshops.
 - The Fire response team is keen to get more involved in schools etc. on doing fire safety demonstrations.
 - We have partnered with Neighbourhood Support New Zealand and they have shown interest in building networks out in Linden. She is keen to arrange some activities etc. with the residents who feel more support is necessary.
 - Plans for Linden Primary School to conduct a Safety themed audit of Linden. The idea is get the student council (6 kids aged 10) to walk around their neighbourhoods and then put together a presentation/report on what they want their neighbourhood and community to look like. Just waiting on the school to confirm dates for that.

Once this is all complete, we will capture all this into a report to be carried through by the Linden coordinator and the community who can hopefully maintain the momentum that is set off.

- **Events/Programmes** established to date:
 - Open Day 16th February was largely successful. Around 30 groups or organisations from the area were represented and a lot of crossover and networking for the groups occurred. Not a huge community turnout, however those that did seemed to enjoy it and it takes time to establish trust in a community. Great support from all the groups involved.
