	David Chick, Willy Trolove, and Andrew Body presented on the Let's Get Wellington Moving initiative noting that while light rail was a popular option in a recent survey, the programme is agnostic regarding system models. It was acknowledged that there is a funding gap that may impact on parts of the initiative such as the Te Aro and Terrace tunnels and the Basin Reserve. Members discussed with presenters: • keeping corporate Wellington involved • the stability of the programme given the different priorities of other organisations such as NZTA and changes to the political landscape over the lifetime of the programme • the bus prioritisation programme • the need to work with Wellington Water to co-ordinate work programmes • the need to get mass transport right before taking away parking spaces • testing the first pilot with the Environmental Reference Advisory Group.	
5.	Parking Policy	
	Presenter: Helen Bolton, Senior Advisor, Wellington City Council	
	Helen Bolton presented on the Parking Policy noting that it had been paused until the role out of <i>Let's Get Wellington Moving</i> . The policy is currently in the engagement phase, and a website has been launched and will be open to the end of August. An early draft report is due in September and a consultation policy by the end of the year. It was acknowledged that legislation to ensure changes may be a final resort. Feedback was sought from members on the presentation by the end of July, including policy	
	objectives and how to best sell the final policy.
