



The Urban Habitat Collective's plan for a co-housing development in Adelaide Road.

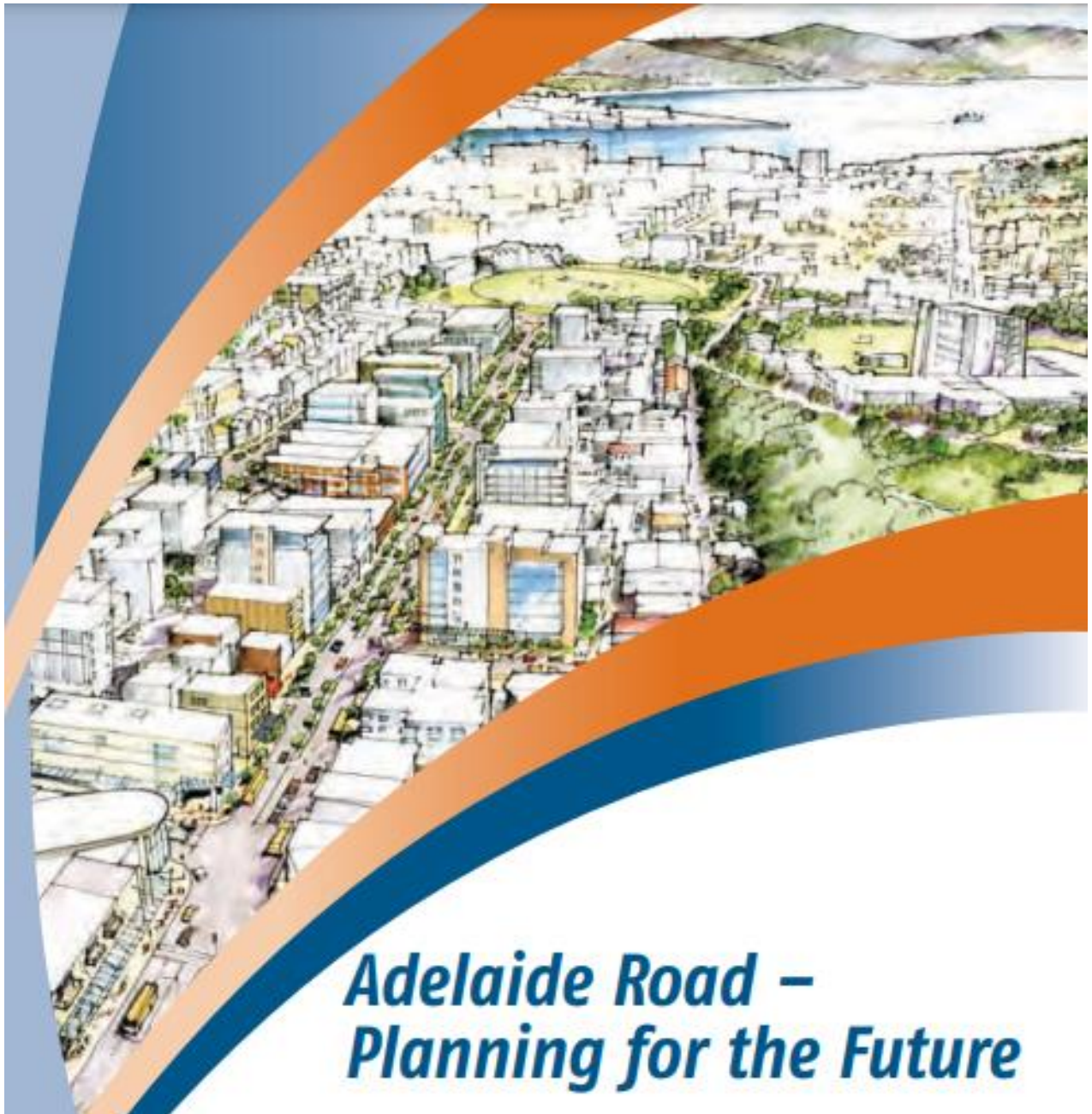
Since planning this they have regrettably abandoned the idea and Kainga Ora has bought the land. Note the height is seven storeys. Approx 24m.



Hauwai Apartments (was called Monark) - 93 one and two bedroom apartments recently completed on Adelaide Road by Wellington Company and Taranaki Whānui ki Te Upoko o Te Ika.

This scale - six storeys in height (21 metres) is more appropriate for its position in Adelaide Road than the CCZ height proposal of 42.5 m (12 storeys).

Adelaide Road – Planning for the Future

A long-term vision for future growth and development

Adopted November 2008 Wellington City Council

*"Its proximity to public transport, the CBD, and major employers and businesses, supports **an active 'live-work' area, ie a mix of commercial and business uses and residential housing (apartments).** Building heights will be higher in this area to achieve this activity mix (**up to a maximum of 24m,** ...building design will need to be of a high quality. . . . To support the increased employment and residential intensity of this area, improvements to the Adelaide Road corridor, including improving pedestrian safety, **street trees, landscaping and public space improvements** are proposed. **Significant heritage buildings will be retained and enhanced** to contribute to the **vibrancy and sense of place of this area.** (Excerpts from the document)*



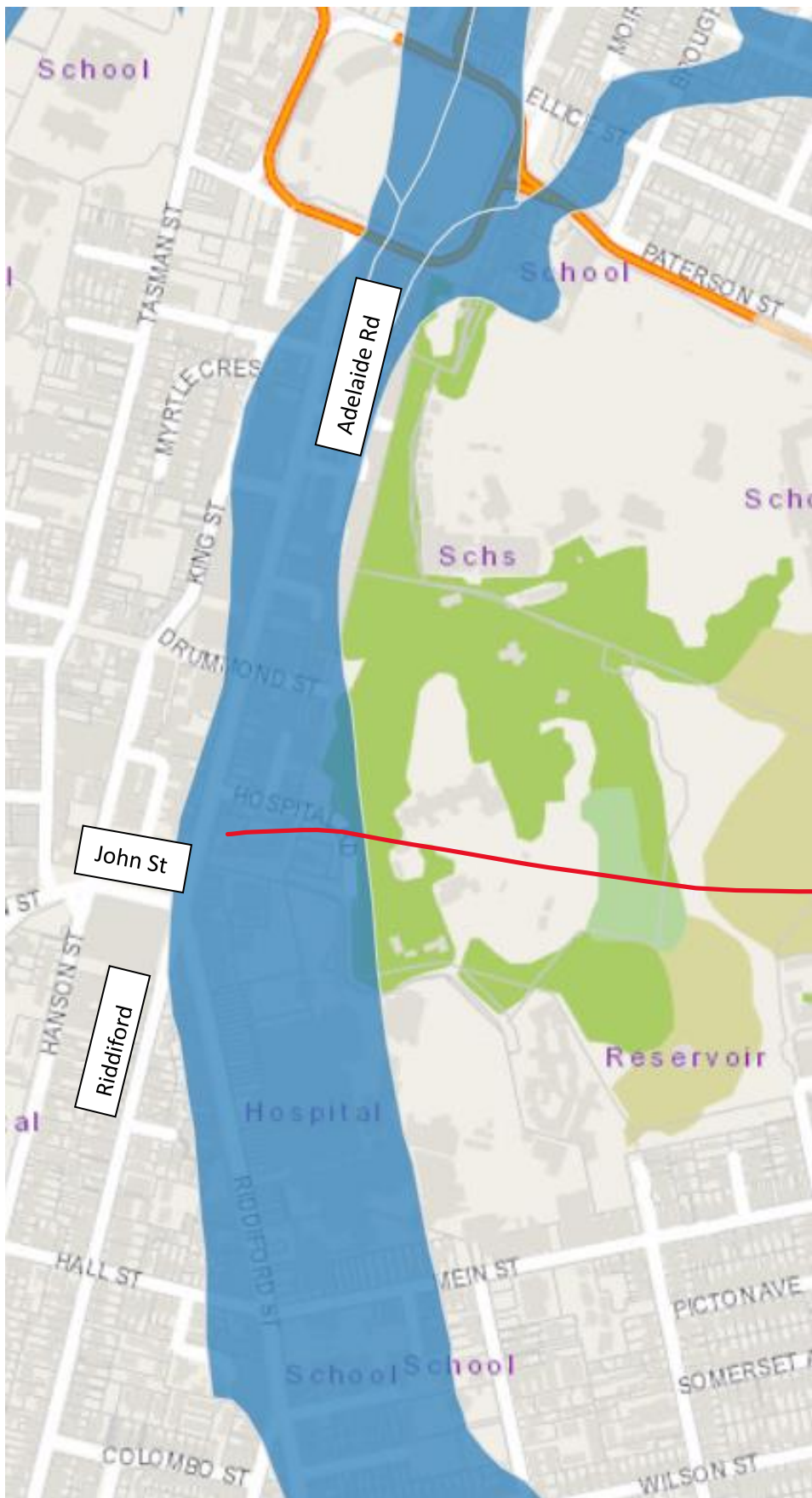
